THRONGS GREET ARCHBISHOP MOONEY ON PONTIFICAL VISIT TO AUBURN

Auburn. Large congregations greeted Most Reverend Archbishop Edward Mooney, Bishop of the Diocese of Rochester, on his first pontifical visit to Auburn, May 27. At 4:30 o'clock in the afternoon Archbishop Mooney conferred the Sacrament of Confirmation upon a class of 173 in St. Alphonse Church, East Auburn, and previously in the afternoon he confirmed a class of 195 in St. Francis d'Assisi Church, West Auburn.

Solemn services were held at St. Alphonse Church of which Rev. Frederick G. Straub is the pastor and at St. Francis Church of which Rev. Peter A. Mois is the pastor. Sermons belittling the occasion were delivered by Archbishop Mooney in both churches. On Sunday evening, Archbishop Mooney was the guest at dinner of Father Straub at the St. Alphonse rectory in East Genesee Street where he remained overnight. After celebrating Mass at 7 o'clock Monday

morning, Archbishop Mooney returned to Rochester. While at St. Alphonse's Bishop Mooney met Very Rev. Dean John A. Conway, pastor of Holy Family Church, the pastor and their assistants of the Auburn Deanery. He also received officers and members of the various church societies and a delegation of Columbian Squires. Father Straub represented Archbishop Mooney at the initiation of 17 candidates into the Columbian Squires at 8 o'clock Sunday evening at the Columbus of Columbus Home. The Columbian Squires, numbering 64, are all members of St. Alphonse Church.

THE FACTS: \$15,000,000 LOSS AS FIRE RAZES WIDE AREA IN CITY

Chicago, May 19—Property damage estimated at more than \$15,000,000 was done by the fire which started in a sheep pen of the Armour Company plant. Sparks from a switching engine were blamed for the conflagration. Fifty-two fire engines and 122 hose companies were concentrated to fight the greatest blaze the city has suffered since the disastrous fire of 1871. Firemen were battling to save a huge quantity of oil and fats in storage. Should the flames reach this material danger of a fresh outbreak was believed imminent. A surging southwest wind whipped up the flames beyond immediate control of all Chicago's fire fighting apparatus. Lack of water pressure, due to the prolonged drought, placed firemen and the 122 engines and fifty-two hose companies under a terrific handicap. An area of almost two square miles of buildings, business and stockyard plants had been destroyed within two hours after the fire broke out. Estimates of damage ranged as high as \$15,000,000, with the total increasing by the minute.

Lourdes Shrine is Lecture Topic of Rev. E. F. Garesche

Elmira. The Rev. Edward F. Garesche, S.J., founder of the International Federation of Nurses, Alumnae, and directors of the Board of Medical Missions in New York City, presented an illustrated lecture on the famous shrine of Lourdes before an assembly of nurses, socialists and members of religious orders in the Dunn Memorial Building of St. Joseph's Hospital, May 21.

During the course of his lecture, he announced that the next meeting of the International Federation of Catholic Nurses will be held in London in 1937. The noted Jesuit priest who is author of the Sodality Manual and other spiritual and religious publications, complimented St. Joseph's Hospital Unit of the Federation and urged all who would find it possible to attend both the London convention and another international medical and health convention to be held in Rome-September of next year.

Outlining briefly in his introductory remarks the details of foundation of the International Federation of Catholic Nurses, Father Garesche made interesting comment on the enthusiasm of response from all quarters of the globe to the call for organization of groups of Catholic men and women engaged in the profession of nursing. He demonstrated the cosmopolitan character of the convention group that assembled for the first time at Lourdes in July, 1923, by stating that all business and reports were given to the convention in three languages, French, German and English. Over 20 nations were represented and the great Basleia for sessions, other quarters first engaged praying inadequate.

In his lecture on Lourdes, Father Garesche noted the facts that mark the practical conviction of genuine cure wrought at the shrine. He declared that Dr. Alexis Carrel, famous surgeon on the staff of the Rockefeller Institute for Medical Research and winner of the Nobel Prize in 1912 for his scientific achievement in surgery, had asserted that there is not the slightest doubt about the authenticity of miracles at the shrine.

"But," said Father Garesche, the greatest miracle there is the resignation of the afflicted and suffering. They come eager for physical aid, seeking help only in a physical sense; and they go away with such resignation.
