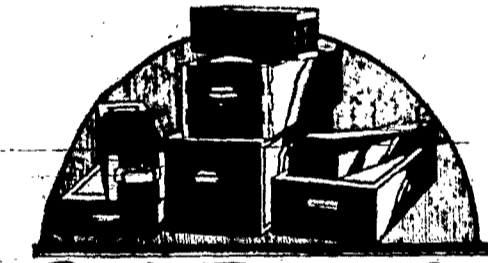

Lincoln Store Unit In Burke Building

With John D. McGinn as manager, Rochester's newest retail establishment, the Lincoln Store, eleventh of the company's operating Lincoln Stores in the country, was opened May 26 in the Burke Building, Main Street East and St. Paul Street.

The Lincoln Store, according to Vice President, H. J. Hickey who was present, are operated on a merchandising plan that places them between the variety stores and the large department stores. Evidently moving merchandise that can be sold at a small profit, most of it priced below \$5, is included in the stock, Mr. Hickey states.

The new Lincoln Store has 17,000 square feet of floor space on the street floor and an equal amount in the basement for sales purposes. Office and stock room space on other floors brings the total space occupied by the company to 40,000 square feet. The tunnel connecting the basement of the Burke Building with the Edwards store is retained.
