

School Superintendent Extends Felicitations

Hundreds of thousands of children like you pour out of our schools every year and become part of the adult population of the country. Perhaps few of you realize that the diploma you take with you represents the least important part of your education.

All during your school years, while you have been struggling with arithmetic and algebra, geography and Latin and English, you have been absorbing, perhaps unconsciously, a philosophy of right living and right thinking.

You have passed examinations in all the subjects you have taken, and the memory of them will grow dim in your mind as the years go by. A year, two years from today, you will have forgotten much that lies within the pages of your text-books.

We do not ask you to remember all these facts that you have been cramming into your heads during this examination period,—dates when battles were fought, the births and deaths of the literateurs of the world, compound fractions, the rivers and lakes of obscure countries. When you need information of this kind in the future, you will know where to find it.
