## Laymen Plan Twentieth Retreat At St. Bernard Seminary June 29

Preparations for holding the 20th annual laymen's retreat or week-end of prayer and meditation at St. Bernard's Seminary beginning June 29 will be made at a meeting of parish chairmen, Friday, June 8, at 8 o'clock in Columbus Civic Center Building. The Rev. Dr. William E. Cowen, pastor of St. Mary's Church, Auburn, moderator of the Laymen's Retreat Association is meeting with the parish chairmen. John P. Keating, president of the association presides. Special effort will be made this year to have a large attendance of Catholic laymen from all points in the diocese make the retreat to celebrate the 20th anniversary. The retreat master will be the Rev. Father Daniel, Capuchin Friar from Providence, R. I., nationally known in the lay retreat movement. 

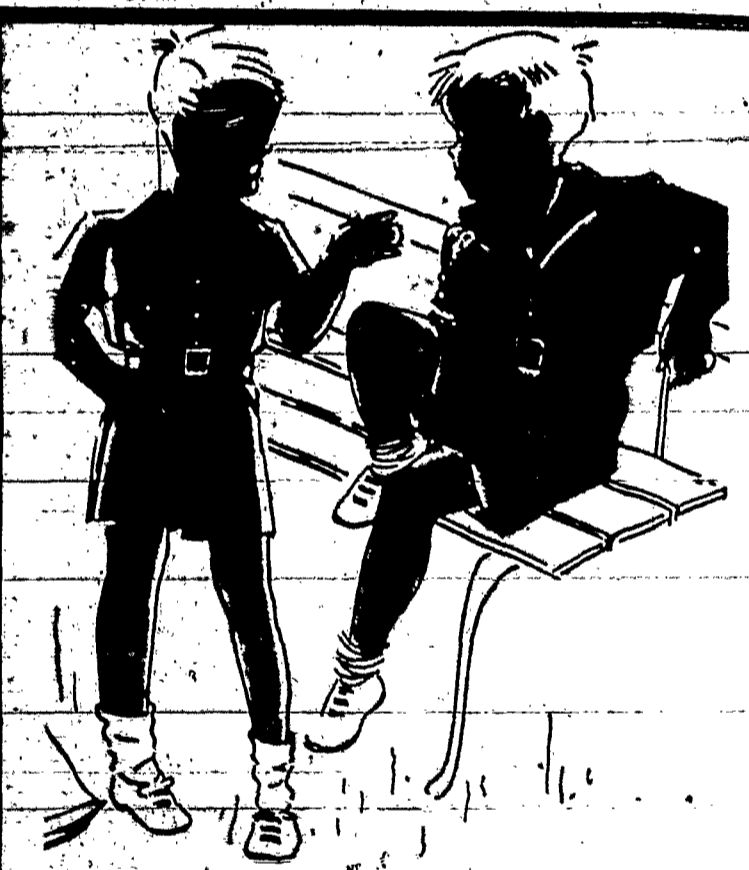
