How and What To Serve - Hints For the Housewife

Hamburg steak, or ground beef, is probably known under more food names than any other meat in the cook book. When you read "Swiss Steak," "Salisbury Steak," "Viennese Roast," etc., on a menu card you may be almost sure that it is Hamburg steak in one of the many disguises.

One of the very best ways to cook Hamburg steak is by broiling it. It can be pattied out into one large piece or made into patties, and placed on a greased broiler. When broiled or pan-fried it should be served immediately with no loss of time and seasoned with butter, salt and pepper.

Probably the most popular way to serve Hamburg is in a meat loaf. The secret of a moist meat loaf lies in the cooking. If the loaf is seared in hot bacon drippings in a hot skillet, or strips of bacon put on the top of it before placing the pan in the oven, it will not shrink or become dry.

- Hamburg Loaf: 2 1/2 lbs. Hamburg Steak, 1 beaten egg, 1/2 tsp. poultry dressing, 1-2 tsp. pepper, 2 tbs. minced green pepper, 1/2 lb. ground veal, 3/4 cup dry bread crumbs, 2 tsp salt, 1/2 tsp. celery salt, 1 cup tomato juice. Mix all these ingredients very thoroughly and lightly. Divide in half and press one half into a well greased loaf pan...
