Niagar Falls.—One hundred degrees, including two honorary degrees of Doctor of Laws, Doctor of Philosophy degree, in course, 17 Masters' degrees and 80 Bachelors' degrees, together with a large number of academic awards were conferred by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Charles E. Duffy, D.D., LL.D., '03, Rector of the Cathedral in Buffalo, who presided Tuesday morning, June 12, at the 27th annual commencement exercises of Niagara University.

The Carthage Railroad

Rochester's first railroad was less than four miles long. It was known as the "Carthage Road" and connected the old Erie Canal with navigation on the river below the Lower Falls and ran along the east bank of the Genesee. This road was completed in 1833.

The rolling stock on this "railroad" consisted of two open cars and a coach, each drawn by two horses hitched tandem fashion.

When making a trip up or down the river, a bugler rode on the rear of the coach, sounding his horns to announce the approach of the car to prospective passengers and shippers.

One of the founders of this primitive railroad—Everard Peck—was also one of the founders of the Rochester Savings Bank.
