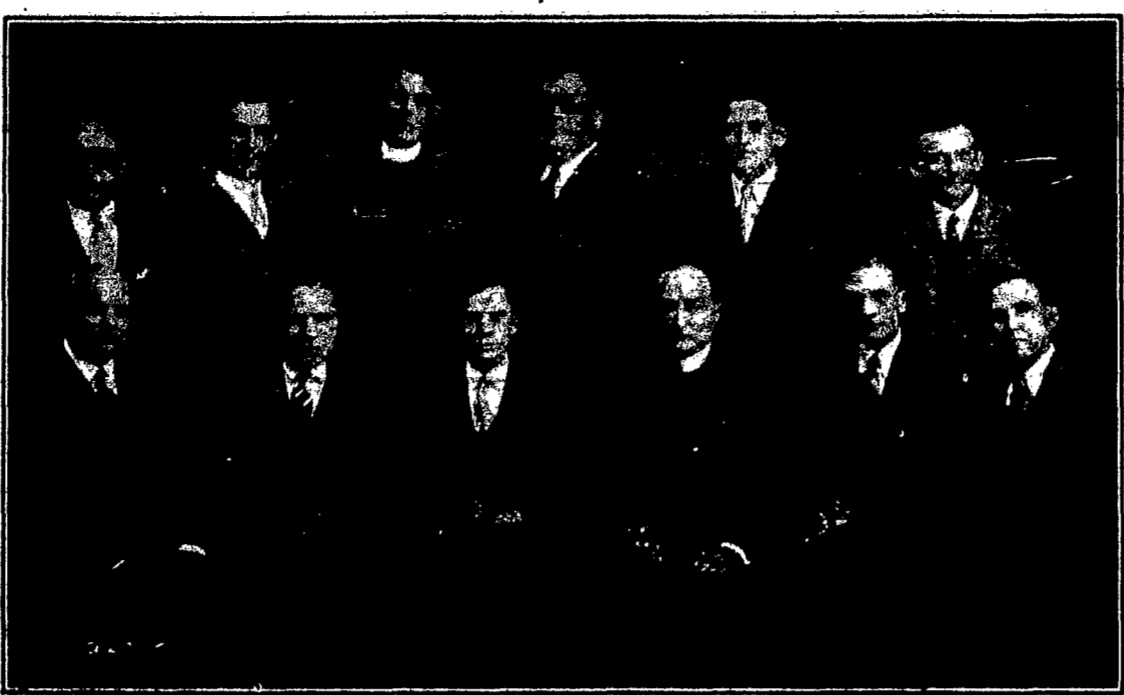

ORGANIZATION OF H. N. UNION TWO YEARS OLD

(Continued from Page One) has contributed materially to the program of Catholic action in the diocese and to the general success of the Union. Keep Anniversary The 50th anniversary of the founding of the Holy Name Society was observed on January 8, 1933 by a series of winter rallies in central churches. On that day, over 10,000 Holy Name men received Holy Communion in their own parish churches in the morning and returned in the afternoon to central churches to take part in uniform services. These rallies again proved that interest in Holy Name work had been aroused. The first annual convention of the Union was held at Columbus Civic Center on March 12, 1933 and was attended by 300 delegates and spiritual directors. Elmira carried the honors of the day with eleven delegates from one parish. The first election of officers for the Union took place at this time and the following were named for the ensuing two years: President, B. Edward Shlesinger; Vice President, William G. Wynn; Vice President, Norman A. O'Brien; Vice President, Charles J. Knapp; Secretary, Roy W. Crissy; Financial Secretary, Andrew Wuest; Treasurer, Joseph Antolina; Marshal, John W. Dringer; Vice President of the Auburn Deanery, William McLane; Vice President of the Geneva Deanery, T. Edward Bickle; Vice President of the Corning Deanery, Richard McElligott; Vice President of the Elmira Deanery, T. Francis O'Dea. Deanery Directors Named On April 1, 1933, Father Stauder announced the appointment by Bishop O'Hern of spiritual directors for the four other deaneries as follows: the Rev. L. A. Jones, Auburn; the Rev. John J. Healy, Geneva; the Rev. Daniel A. McCarthy, Elmira; and the Rev. Lawrence Gannon, Corning. The second annual open-air rally was held in Red Wing Stadium, Rochester, Sunday, June 11. The rally was dedicated to the memory of the late Bishop O'Hern and again Holy Name men gave an outstanding demonstration of their Catholic Faith. The principal clerical speaker was the Rev. Thomas F. Conlon, O.P.P. of New York, National Director of Holy Name Societies; and the principal lay speaker was Alexander I. Roke of New York. During the winter of 1933, the Union decided that a Spiritual Bouquet for the Most Rev. Archbishop Edward Mooney, now Bishop of Rochester, would be an excellent way in which to show our Bishop that the Holy Name societies are an active force in the diocese. On the second Sunday of January, 1934, nearly 7,000 Holy Name men offered their Holy Communion and Masses for the intention and general welfare of Archbishop Mooney. Elmira Union Elects During the latter part of March, this year, the Elmira Deanery Union was organized with the following officers: Spiritual Director, the Rev. Daniel A. McCarthy; President, Clarence H. Kennedy; Vice President, Dr. Walter C. Ervin; Secretary, Thomas H. Dean; Treasurer, John Reidy; Marshal, Stephen Bednarek; and Publicity Chairman, Cornelius J. Milliken. At the organization meeting, it was decided that this year's open-air rally would be held at Elmira. All deaneries are cooperating to make it as big a success as the previous rallies have been. The Rochester Section of the Union, expects from reports at this writing to take over a thousand men from Rochester and surrounding towns on a special train to the rally. The occasion will bring to Elmira the greatest assemblage of Church dignitaries in the history of the Southern Tier. Besides the Most Reverend Archbishop Mooney, there will be present, the Most Rev. Conway, Dean of the Auburn deanery, and priests of the diocese. The procession into the park will form outside the main gate at 7:15 p. m. in the following order: Elmira Assembly, Fourth Degree, Knights of Columbus; Knights of Columbus; Diocesan Union officers, the Hon. Lane, Catholic chaplain at the New York State Reformatory, master of ceremonies; the Rev. Ladislav J. Szepepanki, pastor of St. Casimir's Church, Elmira, assistant master of ceremonies. To Lead Pledge The Holy Name Pledge will be recited, led by Father Groden. The procession leaving the field will be in the following order: Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus, altar boys, members of Nocturnal Adoration Society bearing canopy, clergy, Monsignor, Archbishop Hickey and Archbishop Mooney. The entire assemblage will participate in the singing during the service. The program will include America, O Salutaris, Tantum Ergo, Blessed Be God, and Star Spangled Banner. Two bands will take part, the boys band of St. Ann's Church of Hornell of which the Rev. J. A. Maley is pastor and the Italian Band of Elmira. From various points in the diocese, the men will come, Rochester sending a big delegation by train, others going by automobile. Arrangements are being made for the Rochester men to meet at a given point. With details for the rally practically completed, Elmira looks forward to one of the most momentous occasions in the history of the city.
