As a result of quick action on the part of Oscar Monard, secretary of Elmira Association of Commerce and the Elmira police, a photographer claiming to represent the Catholic Courier who took nictures of several prominent Catholics in Elmira over the past weekend, which he implied were for a special edition of the Catholic Courier, was brought before the Elmira police and promised to leave the city.

Informed that the man was operating in Elmira, the Rev. Leo C Mooney, managing editor of the Catholic Courier issued a warning to the Catholic clergy and laity in Elmira against the photographer who according to reports, represented a New York company.


