ance, not by the church, as politicians allege, but by those same politicians, that the rank and file have become utterly helpless and realize it and have turned their eyes towards heaven as their only hope. Fortunate indeed, it is that they have at least their religion to fall back on and to buoy them up; for this has, in spite of all hardships, kept them content and happy. For confirmation of that ask any traveler.

Against All Religion Father Bucher asserts that "the true purpose of the present government below the line is to destroy not merely the Catholic Church, but all religion as well." "Protestant churches have no more chance of toleration in Mexico than has the Catholic Church, as facts prove," he adds. Declaring that "the paramount pretext for suppressing the Church in Mexico is the charge that she is responsible for the country's 'lack of progress,'" Father Bucher said that "had the Catholic Church in Mexico been left free the Mexican people would be far advanced on the road to literacy and learning."

Catholic Magazines of Note Carry Articles By Nazareth College Nun

Two articles by Sister Rose Marie, Sister of St. Joseph and head of the English Department of Nazareth College, one appearing in the June issue of The Catholic World - "John Dryden, Poet or Not?" and the other in Ave Maria of June 2, (Notre Dame de Chartres).
