The Mass was sung by the Shrine Male Choir, directed by Hugh P. Donlon, and Fourth Degree Knight of Columbus of assemblies in central New York acted as a guard of honor for the Delegate.

A solemn procession to the Ravine, burial place of St. Rene Goupil, was held during the afternoon with the Apostolic Delegate as celebrant at the triple benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament given at the walled chapels. Father Phillips was deacon and Father Keenan sub-deacon.

The Mass was given from the rustic pulpit in the Ravine by the Rev. John J. McGrath, S.J., assistant director of the Shrine.

Arrangements of the program was made by the Rev. Peter F. Cusick, S.J., director of the Shrine since 1931. The celebration marked the fiftieth anniversary of the Shrine on the site of the Mohawk Castle of the Jesuits where the intrepid Jesuit, Isaac Jogues, and his companions, Rene Goupil and John Laande, suffered martyrdom in the middle of the seventeenth century.

Auburn. — Under dark gray, ominous skies more than 6000 persons from all parts of New York State witnessed one of the most elaborate and solemn services ever staged in Enna Jettick Park, three miles south of Auburn at the foot of Owego Lake, Sunday morning when a solemn pontifical Mass was celebrated by Most Reverend Constantine Bohachevsky, D.D., Ukrainian Catholic Bishop of Philadelphia, Pa.

Among the throng that participated in this special observance of Ukrainian Day in Auburn were Ukrainian Catholics from Buffalo, Rochester, Syracuse, Ithaca, Binghamton, Elmira, Utica, Rome, Watertown and other cities.

At 11 o'clock, the program opened with a celebration of the pontifical Mass by Bishop Bohachevsky. Other officers of the Mass included Rev. Frederick G.
