Laxity of Women In Manners and Dress Assailed By Pastor

Prevailing laxity in manners and dress on the part of the young women of today was assailed by the Rev. Patrick M. O'Brien, O. S. B., pastor of St. Joseph's Church, Maplewood, N. J., in a recent sermon.

Americans, he said, are prone to extremes. "Clothing suitable for swimming, is not fit for the streets; clothing for the tennis court is not fit for the streets. There is a sense of fitness which characterizes people who have a true education and culture."

"Decency, i. e. proper thinking, proper clothing, proper actions are the result of self-respect, a pride in oneself which God expects us to have," declared the preacher.

"The beginning of modesty is taught in young childhood. We do not mean a false modesty or prudery, but a correct respect for ourselves. Mothers who think that children of ten or twelve are not included in this campaign for decency, are mistaken. Even young children are immodest. They can wear clothing comfortable, without being immodest. If they grow accustomed to immodesty in youthful years, you cannot teach them anything different when they are grown. In vain will we build schools and inaugurate programs of health if our children are not taught the principles of morality and taught likewise to put these principles into practice in their daily lives. Everyone who has an eye for the good and beautiful will understand that a girl divides the noble, temperate, purity-loving men from the impure and depraved. The campaign of decency is most necessary against the repulsive immodesty which meets our gaze where it is least expected on the public streets. I am not misled into seeking immodesty where it does not exist. I believe that freedom of spirit and constant watchfulness against everything unclean must go hand in hand."

"I repeat that abbreviated costumes and improper behavior exercise an insidious, baneful influence on the young and old that calls for the united opposition of all who love virtue and hate vice."

The Junior Cook

My Junior Cooks have never tried to put up pickles or a relish. It isn't so difficult, but it requires a great deal of thought and work. This week I am giving you a recipe for a pepper relish. Try it! Imagine the big surprise your family will have when you say that you made it!

- Pepper Relish: 12 green peppers, 12 red peppers, 12 small onions, 3 tbs. salt, 4 cups vinegar, 1 cup brown sugar.

Wash peppers and peel onions; put through the food chopper, using the large cutter. Add 3 tbs. salt and allow mixture to simmer on the back of the stove for 10 minutes; drain through a colander and add 4 cups vinegar and 1 cup brown sugar; put back on the stove and bring to the boiling point; let boil 5 minutes, stirring so it will not scorch on the bottom of the pot. Then pour into clean, hot jars and seal immediately. This is a delicious relish.
