Catholic Women's Club Plans Membership Drive For 1934-35

Thirty-four teams will launch the Membership Drive of the Catholic Women's Club. With the oncoming arrival of the winter season and just before the first of the social and club activities begin, the Catholic Women's Club will launch its 1934-35 season with a campaign for new members.

The purpose of this Club is to promote works of educational, social and charitable character in the city of Rochester and the improvement of the religious, intellectual and so far as possible temporal welfare of young women.

The names of the Captains and team workers of the parishes will be announced later. The first meeting of the Captains and team workers will be held Tuesday, October 2, at the Club House, to discuss the details of the drive.

The Program Committee of the Club at a meeting on Friday evening outlined in general the Club program for the year 1934-35. The engagement of three noted speakers for supper and luncheon meetings will be of interest to its members.

The Mission Group will hold its meeting Friday evening at the Club House. The Business Women's Group will hold its first meeting of the season, Monday evening, October 1, and will consist of a supper meeting, followed by cards.
