Fr. Kennedy, Corning Native, Buried at Vincentian Seminary

Requiem Mass for the Rev. James F. Kennedy, C. M., professor at St. John's College, Brooklyn, and former pastor of St. John the Baptist Church, Brooklyn, who died at age 64 years, Wednesday of last week, in St. Mary's Hospital, Rochester, was celebrated Saturday in Brooklyn.

Interment took place at the Vincentian Community seminary in Germantown, Philadelphia.

Father Kennedy was taken ill with pneumonia while spending his vacation in Corning. He was brought to St. Mary's Hospital for treatment. He was a close friend of Archbishop Thomas F. Hickey and visited Rochester diocese frequently.

Born in Corning in 1870, Father Kennedy was educated in the Catholic schools there and was graduated from Niagara University. Joining the Vincentians, he began his novitiate at St. Vincent's Seminary, Germantown, in 1893. He was ordained in Philadelphia, June 8, 1895.

After some parish work he joined the Vincentian mission band and traveled most of the eastern United States. In 1908 he was assigned to Brooklyn and in 1925 was named pastor. While pastor he was particularly active in the affairs of St. John's University Auxiliary.

Attempt To Ruin Alhambra Jesuits Marker Discovered

Vandals have attempted to remove the huge bronze plaque from the granite marble monument erected by the Musa Caravan, Order of the Alhambra to early Jesuit Missionaries at Dann's Corners near Honeye Falls and Lima it was learned this week.

Past Grand Commander Herman G. Hetzler, who was one of the prime figures in having the monument erected, in company with the Rev. Peter J. Cusick, S. J., director of the North American Martyrs Shrine at Auriesville paid a recent visit to the monument, it being Father Cusick's first view of the imposing tablet.

It was discovered that an effort had been made to remove one of the large bolts holding the bronze to the granite. It was believed that someone saw in this four hundred pound bronze plate an opportunity to realize on its value. State police and the sheriff's office have been notified by Grand Commander Daniel J. O'Mara.

Mr. Hetzler who is the head of Hetzler Foundries, Inc. will replace the bolt as quickly as possible to prevent theft of the plaque.
