Is Notre Dame heading back to a place in the gridiron sun? That's the question which pops out all over the sport pages in the wake of the rather unexpected and spectacular victory the Ramblers scored over Army before 81,000 howling fans Saturday.

The positive answer to that query of course is shrouded by the future but many of our foremost ex- perts are inclined to nod an affirmative after taking stock of Coach Elmer Layden's first year results.

Nobody expected Layden to produce a world- beater in his first year at the school. He came to inaugurate his own system of coaching and rough edges were bound to crop up on a team drilled by "Hunk" Anderson for several years.

The boys started off on the wrong foot by losing to Texas. They followed with three straight wins. Then came a pair of losses and now two more wins. The Ramblers wind up their season Saturday against Southern California on the coast but, regardless of the outcome of that battle, they will finish on the right side of the ledger as far as games won and lost are concerned.

The fact remains that, even in the games in which they were defeated, the Fighting Irish showed flashes of latent power which should assert itself not later than next season.

Notre Dame has floundered about quite a bit since the tragic death of Knute Rockne a few years back. Anderson took hold and put forth his best efforts but they seemingly were of no avail.

Boys Their Interests

Is Notre Dame finished in the football world? Herbert Reed, a sports writer, in an article in the "Commonweal" declares that they are very far from being dead.

The world once used to accuse the Church of forcing people to believe in its creed. They shouted "Inquisition!" and even succeeded in digging up a few cases such as Galileo, which delighted their souls.

And the same thing is being done in this country. "Modern atheistic professors are the murderers of souls. With the aid of compulsory school attendance laws they have become unjust aggressors, against whom we may and must defend our youth.

In other words the Public Schools are teaching a RELIGION and that religion is ATHENISM. They refuse to read the Bible because that is Religion. But so is ATHENISM, a religion.
