## Clean Film Campaign Made Permanent With Renewal of Pledges

newed annually by the faithful. He paid tribute to those outside the Church who have cooperated in the campaign.

Remain Steadfast

Officers of the Legion of Decency were re-elected in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia at the quarterly meeting of the Diocesan Union of Holy Name Societies. The importance of the motion picture boycott was stressed by speakers. The Rev. John J. McKenna, Diocesan Director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, outlined the work thus far accomplished by the Legion of Decency and said that Philadelphia Catholics are being observed by the people of the entire nation and applauded for the steadfastness of their adherence to their pledge.

All regulations, general and particular, that have been given in his diocese are to be continued in full force in the campaign against indecent pictures, the Most Rev. Thomas C. O'Reilly, Bishop of Scranton, said in a letter to members of the clergy. Directing that the pledge be renewed, he said: "We rely upon the zeal of our clergy to place this matter before their people according to Catholic standards and above all to teach clearly that the distinction between right and wrong is as enduring as the moral principles upon which it is based." No lists of approved films will be issued in the Diocese, Bishop O'Reilly announced.

The Most Rev. Michael J. Gallagher, Bishop of Detroit, directed that the Legion of Decency be placed on a permanent basis within his diocese and likewise ordered a general renewal of the pledge, which took place in all churches Sunday.

Indorsement of the crusade has been given by the Toledo Diocesan Councils of Catholic Men and Catholic Women. The accomplishments of the Legion of Decency were told by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Max J. Waltz, Chancellor of the Diocese.

A campaign to win the support of New York Jewry to the film crusade has been launched by the Metropolitan League of Jewish Community organizations. The program calls for neighborhood meetings of adults to organize public training for wholesome movies, a training course for prospective leaders of motion picture groups, public lectures, and instruction in motion picture appreciation.

A charge that the motion pictures are responsible for inciting immorality was made at the South Carolina Baptist Convention in Columbia, S. C. A resolution urged an appeal to Congress to clean up the films.

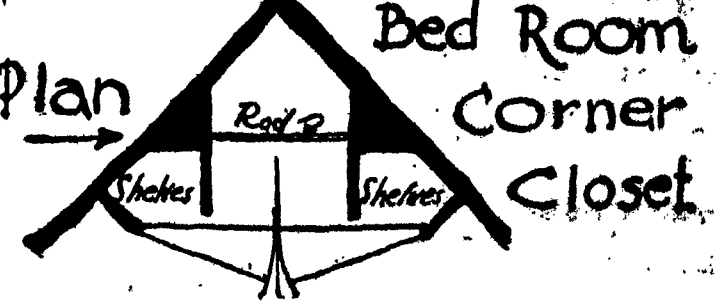
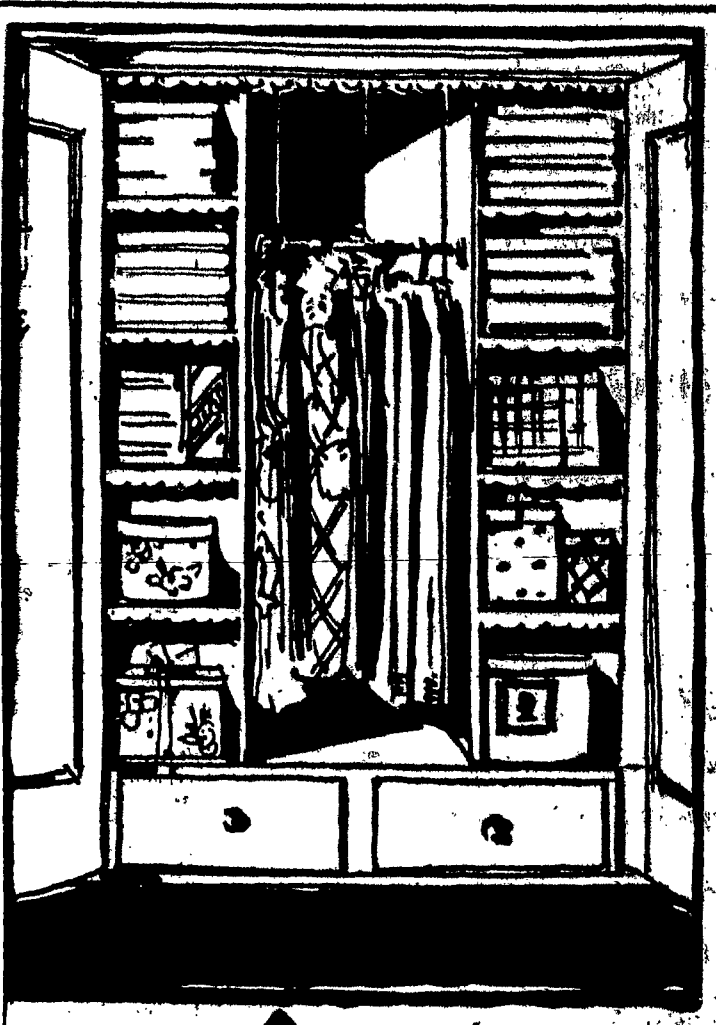
HOLY APOSTLES' COMMITTEES GET READY FOR BAZAAR

EXTRA BEDROOM CLOSET

The children may now be grown up and require a varying set-up. Think of the storage space for the winter's clothes and the arrangements for cleaning and house-keeping appliances.

MANY times, in remodeling an old house, we find limited room for a bedroom closet. I have found it convenient to build the closet in the corner of the room, making it a decorative feature of the room as well as a useful adjunct.

This closet, you will notice, has a pair of long doors which swing over the hanging space and shelves. The interior is divided by two vertical boards between which a rod is hung and over which the clothes hangers fit.

The space on either side of the vertical boards, which varied in depth due to the angle of the wall, is used for shelves.

Below these are two drawers. Finish above the doors with wall-board and paper directly over it, matching the room paper.
