

ROCHESTER HOLY NAME PROTESTS U.S. INTERFERENCE IN MEXICO

Holy Name Deanery Delegates Adopt Resolution Following Address By Judge Donnelly

Plan Distribution of Resolution Among Societies For Individual Protest; Elect Shlesinger Head of New Set of Officers in Deanery

Calling upon the United States government to cease its interference in Mexican affairs, the Rochester Deanery of the Holy Name Union adopted an emphatic resolution on the Mexican situation at their quarterly meeting held Tuesday, January 28, in Immaculate Conception auditorium.

Delegates from each Holy Name Society in Monroe County met to elect officers and review their 1934 activities. Judge Donnelly, former county judge, the following resolution was adopted: "We, the people of Mexico, are fully capable of governing themselves without the intervention of any foreign power. We believe they are governed by the laws of the United States in the full spirit of the terms they should have agreed upon."

"We believe they have been prevented from enjoying them by the intervention of the United States government. We assert, without fear of successful contradiction, that for at least 20 years the people of Mexico have been governed by the laws of the United States. We further assert that the intervention has been a source of suffering and sorrow to the people of Mexico. We demand that the United States government cease its interference in the affairs of Mexico."
