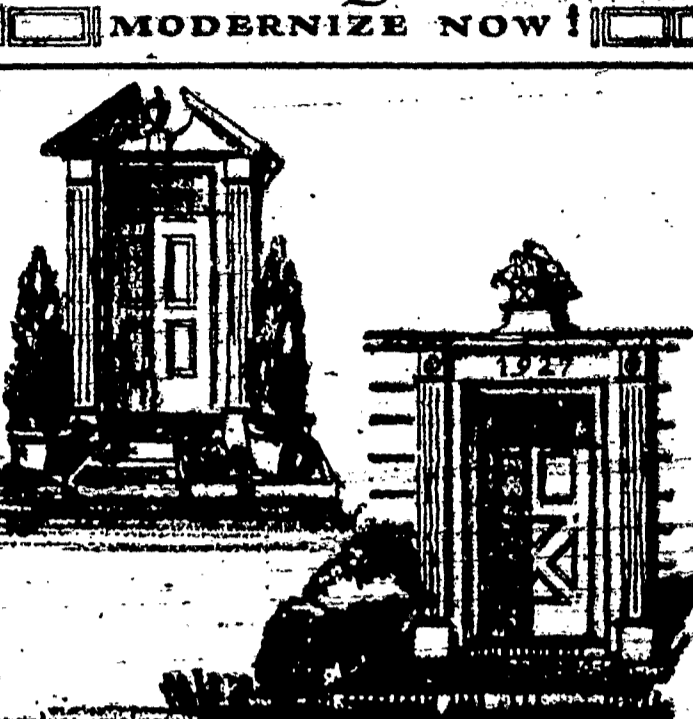
Sacred Heart Auxiliary Plans Valentine Party In Parish Hall, Feb. 14

TRY A NEW DOORWAY Many of the older houses have an unattractive entrance door, stoop or porch which greatly detracts from the appearance of the home. Replacing the exterior of the house is not bad otherwise, and so you may be able to reconduct your home and bring it up to date at slight expense by simply removing the old entrance door and frame and substituting a new, fresh entrance. Begin by tearing down the old stoop or porch. Build a plain platform and steps of stone or brick. Purchase and install in small-cost a new stock entrance door and frame. Your house will now take on a new and up-to-date appearance. Entrance doors similar to the ones shown above may be bought from stock designs at surprisingly small cost.
