SCHOOL STRIKE CALL ISSUED DESPITE BAN

Government cannot expect this type of education "without failing its most rudimentary duties" as a parental organization, it is stated. Because socialistic education destroys the family "by depriving parents of their children, by accepting free love and indorsing dangerous sexual education," because of its "atheistic and attacks all religious beliefs," and further, because it denies parents their right "freely to educate their children," the National Union of Fathers of Families calls upon all parents to defend their rights by calling a general school strike "so long as Article 2 of the Constitution as amended shall be in force."

Private schools in Mexico City, attended for the most part by foreign children, opened last Monday after having complied with the requirements of the law as to social education. They report, in general, a decrease in registrations accounted for the fact that Catholic children, foreign as well as Mexican, are to be educated within their homes.

When asked by a group of reporters to define academic education Minister Garcia Tellez said that the educational program had been stated clearly in his statement of December 22, 1934. "The substance of the law," he said, "denies and disowns the absolute and unassailable right of private ownership in accord with the criterion of the Constitution of 1917 itself which imprisons upon private ownership the condition that the public interest demands."

The Minister was asked whether an attempt is being made to train the young generation in a revolutionary spirit in the sense that the young people would fight against the capitalist regime so that at a propitious moment the dictatorship of the proletariat could be established as a means of destroying the bourgeois regime. "Yes," he replied, since the President of the Republic, in his tour of the country, in his speech at Campeche, had declared that he wishes the active participation of the proletariat in the composition of the Authority and there could be taken as an example his own political work accomplished in the State of Michoacan where the councils and the local legislature were made up of authentic representatives of organized labor.

When asked about the possible effect of the freedom of the universities upon the socialist education obtained in preparatory schools Minister Garcia Tellez said: "I believe that the generation prepared in the schools is destined to the active participation of the proletariat in the struggle for the emancipation of the proletariat will serve as the advance guard in the unification of Mexican youth with the destinies and redemptions of the working class."

NEED OF ASSURED ANNUAL INCOME FOR WORKERS CITED BY DR. HAAS

Administration has already gone a long way in recognizing the justice of this principle of increased annual income. In the first place, it has increased yearly wages by raising workers from the necessity of hiding against one another, below minimum wage and above maximum hour levels. In addition, there are a few codes guaranteeing a weekly wage irrespective of the number of hours worked that the burden is placed squarely upon the employer to provide income for the workers who are ready and willing to work. But also a number of codes require the payment of wages during waiting time in a factory and NRA Administrative Order X-124 extends this to all codes. Even while a man is not working, he is entitled to a minimum wage and it is attached to the employer and the industry, he is entitled to payment. Labor cannot too strongly urge the extension of this principle to include a recognized and supervised minimum level of wages must be adequate, as the only real protection for the American worker.

Assured Annual Income

"But there are other methods available to the Administration in addition to the inclusion in codes of provisions that have just suggested. The National Industrial Recovery Act includes in its purposes the policy of Congress to induce and maintain the united action of labor and management under adequate governmental sanction and supervision. Labor is prepared to cooperate with management in the handling of the problem of adequate annual income. Indeed through a period of years a number of governmental dealing cooperatively with the employers in their industries have made substantial gains toward establishing higher annual earnings for their members. Such efforts have been made and appear to be excessively high hourly wages which, when stable employment is not practicable, are a form of, or at least a beginning toward an annual wage. Such cooperation has stimulated some extension of the production period through a longer period of the year, and in some instances resulted in guarantees of annual incomes in the form of lump sums or of unemployment insurance. Indeed the record of such accomplishments prove strikingly that such efforts have been far more important than those initiated alone by private individual employers. Labor strongly urges, therefore, that the Administration make it a part of its program to promote higher annual earnings by developing and fostering the mutual cooperation that comes from the shorter work week of workers with their employers."

"This is a program of social security which is fundamental, direct and sound. Other efforts looking toward social security, are to be undertaken and supported and labor does support them. But beyond all other schemes, big assured annual earnings to workers must come from the direct relationship between employer and employee, supervised by government, to the extent that such supervision is necessary."

MEXICAN EMBASSY DENIAL OF PERSECUTION BLASTED

Washington.—(NCWC)—A statement just issued by the Mexican Embassy to the United States here, that there is no religious persecution in Mexico, is "absolutely contrary to fact" and is "purposefully worded to mislead the people of the United States and of other nations," it is declared in a vigorous statement issued here Friday by the Very Rev. Dr. John Burke, C. S. P., General Secretary of the National Catholic Welfare Conference.

The Embassy statement denied religious persecution existed, and quoted a recent expression by President Cardenas of Mexico that citizens in that country were not molested in the practice of any religion, and also that ministers of religion complying with the laws "are exercising their ministry in Mexico City and throughout the Republic without being molested in the least."

Dr. Burke refutes the Embassy's statement directly by citing the very laws now enforced in Mexico. He marshals six categories of persecution, emphasizing that in each case the withholding of religious liberty is under legal enactments of Mexican governmental bodies.

of bitter hatred, of coughing and of sicker."

Striking out against the Federal Reserve Bank, which he characterized as the Gibraltar of the plutocrats, Fr. Coughlin said that it is the program of the National Union for Social Justice to put the Government into the banking business "insofar as it issues loans for small business at a reasonable rate of interest." He added that "it is not our purpose to put the individual banker out of business provided he wishes to loan real United States money instead of manufactured money."

The National Union, Fr. Coughlin said, advocates that the Government finance its public works and pay its employees directly out of the National Treasury and secured by the wealth of the Nation and not by the wealth of the Government. He said that the Government should not be a borrower of money, but that it should be a lender of money to our Government.

It is the proposal of the National Union for Social Justice, the speaker said, to nationalize this organization which is under the name of the Federal Reserve Bank.
