Church and Social Justice Topic for K. of C. Thursday

At the last meeting of the Council, Feb. 21, the Rev. Charles J. Bruton, pastor of St. Margaret Mary's Church, led the discussion on the subject, "Faithful, True and Brave." Bruton presented charts in his talk that the Catholic Church is the one agency honestly trying to solve the problems of war.

After citing various organizations whose purposes are ostensibly to bring about peace, Father Bruton declared the misdirected aims of such groups and showed where many of them teach Communism under the guise of seeking for peace. Saying that the causes of war are found in the seven capital sins: Pride, covetousness, lust, anger, gluttony, envy and sloth, Father Bruton said, "Take down your history books and look at the causes of all wars of history and you will find that you can group them all under one or the other of these seven headings. You need not bother about disarmament, World Court, League of Nations or any of the other of the panaceas for peace. There is one and only one remedy for peace, and that is God and His Commandments."

Dr. Judson F. Browne, U. S. Reserve Officer, presented Father Bruton's charts and spoke of the importance of proving, he said, the inadequacy of this nation's national defense. Support of Senator Borah's resolution in Congress for an investigation into the Mexican situation was voiced by the Knights in a resolution adopted.
