

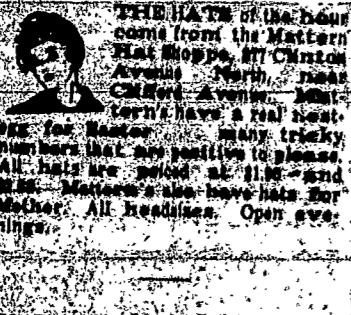

State Regent Urges CDA Group Members To Greater Activity

Elmira—Speaking before the banquet meeting of the district conference of the Catholic Daughters of America, Sunday evening at the Hotel Rathbun, Mrs. Margaret Tynan, State Regent, urged members to take an active part in the functions of the organization, especially those sponsored by the national group.

Mrs. Tynan was guest of honor at the district meeting here Sunday afternoon and evening, which opened with a business meeting in the rooms of Court St. Rita, 137. Approximately 150 women attended from all courts in this district.

The State Regent, in her afternoon address, related the history of the Catholic Daughters of America. Organized 20 years ago for social purposes, the society later received the approval of the Holy Father. From a membership of 50, this order has grown to a membership of 200,000, and is organized in the United States and all the outlying possessions.

This month marks the fifteenth anniversary of the organization of the National Council of Catholic Women. In March, 1920, 200 Catholic women, sent from the various dioceses by their bishops, met in Washington at the invitation of...

Most Rev. Joseph Schrembs, B. D., Bishop of Cleveland, and the National Council of Catholic Women came into being and its first board of directors was elected.

Inspired by the ability and zeal and enthusiasm of that first group of women who answered the call to participate in the apostolate of the hierarchy, the work of developing the National Council of Catholic Women has progressed year by year. From diocese to diocese, from parish to parish, from organization to organization until today the National Council comprises 64 diocesan councils, 17 national, 6 state and 2,000 local organizations representing more than 600,000 Catholic women, are affiliated with it.

Our thanks goes out to these pioneer women for the service they have rendered to the Council. Individually and collectively we have benefited from the soundness of their judgment, and today we have the joy of looking together into the future and envisioning the realization of their dreams.

The fifteenth anniversary of the National Council of Catholic Women reminds us that the life of a well-managed organization far exceeds the activities of any group of women connected with it. For more frequent note of the changing personnel, and during the life of the National Council and the Diocesan Councils many a woman has carried the official burden for a short distance along the pathway only to pass it on to someone else who will maintain the effort.

To those of us who today are privileged to "carry on" in this short work of the lay apostolate a challenge has been given.

We want to make this anniversary month of March a banner one in the history of the National Council.
