Constant Vigilance Needed While real encouragement has been given to all forces working for a wholesome screen by the improvement in the moving pictures during the past months, the Committee cannot lay too great stress on the necessity of constant vigilance if the evil film is to be permanently banished. Pictures which are subversive of morality should be vigorously denounced everywhere and should not receive public support. On the other hand, clean and wholesome films that have merit as entertainment or instruction and conform to the moral standards of Catholic morality should receive the patronage to which they are entitled.

The Episcopal Committee urges the continued and united support of Catholics, but also of the unnumbered thousands not of the Catholic faith who have joined in concerted action against the menace of the immoral cinema. This is necessary, that the ground gained may not be lost.

The young seminarian was ordained to the priesthood March 25, 1883, by Bishop McQuaid in St. Patrick's Cathedral, Rochester. Shortly thereafter he was assigned to teach in St. Andrew's Seminary where he was a professor for eight years.

After a year of study and travel abroad, Dr. Hartley returned to Rochester for the opening of St. Bernard's Seminary, St. Paul, N. Y., in 1893 when he began his work as rector and professor of moral theology. Bishop McQuaid resided in the seminary fifteen years, as president.

The other members of the first faculty were the Reverend Edward J. Hagg, D.D., professor of dogmatic theology, Archbishop Hanna on account of ill health resigned from the seminary in 1895; St. Francis, Rev. Andrew E. Breen, D.D., was professor of exegesis and introduction to Sacred Scripture.
