

Scholarships Are Available at Catholic Univer.

Thirty-four scholarships in the Graduate School of Arts and Sciences at the Catholic University of America in Washington for the academic year of 1935-36 have been announced by Dr. Roy J. Deferrari, dean.

The 23 Knights of Columbus Fellowships for men, representing the largest single block of scholarships in a Catholic institution in the United States, grant tuition, board and room for one academic year of graduate study and may be renewed if in the opinion of the faculty the nature and type of the work require it. Work may be done in any department of the university under these fellowships.

The Fenwick Fellowships for studies in diplomacy, international affairs and foreign relations are granted to men who have completed at least one year of graduate work and carry a stipend of \$1200. Three scholarships, usually for Catholic colleges for women, grant tuition only for study in any department of the university. These are among the few opportunities for women to study in a Catholic university and are administered by the board of trustees of the university because of their special importance in the promotion of the Catholic University for higher education.

Catholic Heroes. The World War Honor Roll of the Catholic Church in the United States is now being compiled by the National Council of Catholic Bishops. The names of several Lieutenants and Sergeants of the Marine Corps, Lieutenant Junior Grade, and other members of the United States Navy, are being included in the list.
