DECREES OF THE THIRD PLENARY COUNCIL OF BALTIMORE REGARDING EDUCATION

The Fathers of the First Plenary Council of Baltimore have decided in the clearest terms that these are the schools in which a very great number of parents, if not all, both using their own right and obeying the law...

In the XIII decree they state: "We urge the Bishops, and, taking into consideration the serious evils which usually result if the children are not properly instructed..."

The Fathers of the Second Council of Baltimore, No. 430, have taught (the following): "The fact that the only way that is left to combat these terrible evils and misfortunes (namely the deadly contamination of indifference and corruption of morals)...

On November 24, 1870, the Sacred Congregation for the Propagation of the Faith sent to all our Bishops an instruction of the Sacred Office in which the Ordinals are advised to use every means possible to prevent the flock entrusted to their care from receiving a purely secular education...

Finally, we propose to mention here the Encyclical of Pope Leo XIII to the French Bishops (February 8, 1884) by which the necessity of Christian education in Catholic schools both in the plain and in the cities...
