Church In India Deserves Prayers Of All — Bishop

In India, where 250,000,000 Hindus and 90,000,000 Mohammedans maintain their conventional religious systems with all their traditional strength, not all the lavish love of Christ for souls, not all the strenuous labor of St. Thomas, Apostle, and St. Francis Xavier, not all the ceaseless efforts of a long line of zealous missionaries supported by faithful heroic missionaries down through the ages have been in vain. For, the 3,000,000 Catholics of India, though only one per cent of the entire population, are well organized under eleven Archbishops, 30 Bishops, and five Vicars Apostolic. They have all the Catholic organizations common to the Church in the world over, such as the Society for the Propagation of Faith, the Apostleship of Prayer, and Catholic Action. They have large colleges each attended by 1,000 to 2,000 students. They have their seminaries, monasteries, and convents, where chosen souls are being trained for Christ and His Church. The Church in India with its well-organized Catholic life is an island of light in an otherwise overwhelmingly pagan land. It teaches by living example the way to eternal salvation, and is a light to those who sit in darkness and superstition. It is a balm to the pierced Heart of Christ on the Cross, and a joy to His Resurrection. The Church of India deserves the best prayers and sacrifices and the constant charity of the entire Catholic world in its constant endeavor to bring India's millions under the sweet and saving rule of Christ the Eternal King.

Association Has Found 2,014 Orphan's Family Homes in Two Decades

A record of 2,014 Catholic orphan's placed in family homes and 1,339 permanently adopted by their foster parents is the 20-year record of the Catholic Home Finding Association of Illinois, an activity of the Knights of Columbus, according to a report made at a meeting of the association. In the past year, 61 couples in this state have accepted orphan children in their homes through the efforts of the association, while 35 permanently adopted children previously placed with them.

The News Letter of the International Federation of Catholic Alumnae carries an announcement by Miss Dorothy Whitman, chairman of the Federation's Bureau of Colleges, stating that a Catholic College Day will be held in May under the auspices of alumnae in every city and town where there is a Catholic college.
