## Angelus Bell Will Ring Out Start Of Clyde's Centennial Celebration

Clyde—Ring of the angelus at St. John's Catholic Church Thursday noon, May 2, will be an official signal of the beginning of Clyde's observance of the 100th anniversary of its incorporation as a village in Wayne County, May 2, 1835.

Simultaneously the bells of other churches and the five areas atop the town hall will toll Clyde residents that the centennial celebration is under way. Exercises will take place during the afternoon and evening in the village park and Grange Hall.

St. John's School will participate in the parade. The pupils will be instructed by their teachers when to report for the parade. Several members of the parish are acting on committees for the centennial. Most prominent is Mayor G. O. Wadley. He called the meeting at which the observance was planned. Later he issued a proclamation for a civic half-holiday May 2. Mayor Wadley is secretary of the general committee of which Joseph G. Corrigan is chairman of the finance committee. Harold A. Nichols, chairman of the publicity committee. Edward Redder member of the Boy Scout committee. John Walsh, Matthew Fischette member of the fraternal committee. Interesting to parishioners as the centennial falls approaches is the history of St. John's Catholic Church, 90 years old. The "Land-of-the-Wayne County" records "St. John's Roman Catholic Church of Clyde had its inception in services of that denomination which were held in Thomas Hickey's building by the Rev. Father Gibson about 1845. Priests occasionally visited the village until 1851, when the first edifice, a wooden building was erected at a cost of \$1,300. It was in the charge of the Rev. Thomas O'Brien who was the first pastor. In the spring of 1869 the corner stone of the present brick and stone edifice was laid, and on Christmas following midnight mass was celebrated by the Rev. J. P. Stewart. It is a great credit to the parish that it was erected in August, 1870, by Bishop McQuinn and Father Stewart. The building cost \$22,500. The parish has 1,000 communicants. This was in 1929 there are 1,500 now. The present (1895) pastor is the Rev. Father J. J. Gleason. The rectory south of the church was built in 1872, and remodeled in 1891. The Sunday

## BISHOP WALSH AT CAIP MEET URGES ACTION

000,000 American Catholic articulate, vocal on the subject of world peace.

Insisting that "all Catholic-minded people desire peace," Bishop Walsh asked "Is it not fundamental to our belief that all human beings are creatures of God; that all creatures of God have claim on the love of their fellow creatures?"

"And yet," he added, "united as we are by so many ties and governed by one law of Christian charity, we have been willing to go on year after year being investigated with regard to the ever-recurring problem of war."

"There is no item in our Holy Father's program for the welfare of the world today," Bishop Walsh continued, "that is more vital than that item which has to do with prayer and labor for peace."

"Prayer is our substitute for labor," the Bishop said. "Prayer is not a substitute for thought. Prayer is a vigorous and a vigorous missionary apostolate. But prayer will give us vigor, will give us strength, will help us to overcome ourselves from our lethargy."

"Peace Possible, Attainable," Bishop Walsh said "there are two things we must put into Catholic minds. First, the world is possible and attainable, that peace is possible and attainable, and second, that the conviction brought to the common people of necessity that peace is possible and that by doing it and demand, bringing it their government will be brought to a realization of its desirability and possibility. We must reach the common people with very clear explanations of what the Catholic principles of social justice mean."

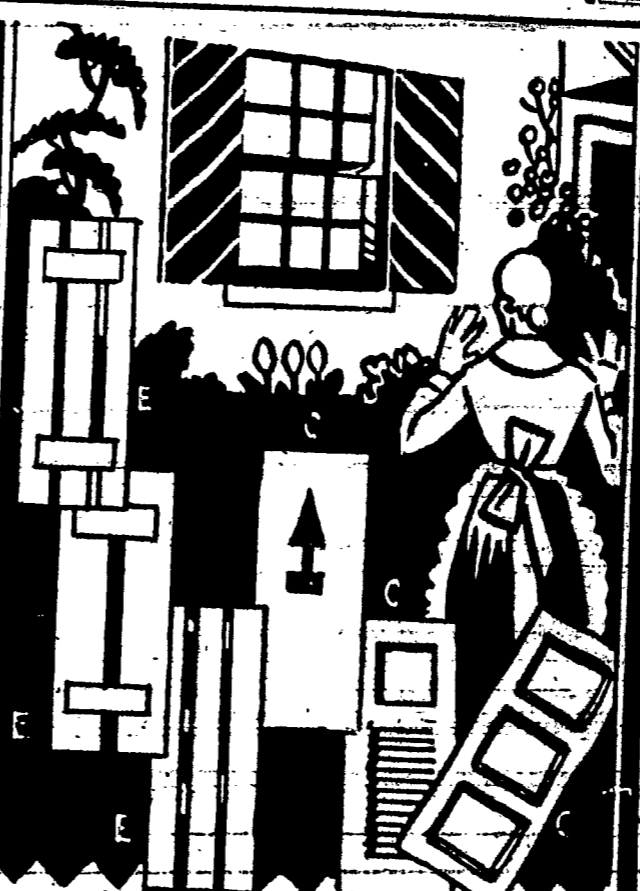
**RAVAGE MISSION AREA**

**BLINDS**

WINDOW blinds greatly improve the appearance and appeal of the home. Blinds lend an air of gaiety and color to the otherwise somber walls and help up the external appearance.

If your home is already equipped with blinds, repaint them in a color contrasting with the walls of the house. Try a brighter shade of color than is usually used and you will be surprised with the results.

Or have new blinds made to fit the window opening. Hardware is standard and can be purchased at any hardware store.

In the series of blinds illustrated, the three types on the lower right marked C are very effective in color and frame houses. The group on the lower left denoted E lends beauty to the English type of brick house.

**Home Games**

You can now play nearly any game you want to, right at home, on concrete. For instance, paddle tennis, a fast game, requires a court 40 ft. x 18 ft. It might go on the back of your property.

Ping-pong tables are now moved out of doors and made of concrete. The tables may be used for other purposes when the game is not in swing.

Badminton requires a court 44 ft. x 20 ft.

Rogue needs a court 60 ft. x 30 ft. with a concrete curb 4 ft. high.

Desk tennis requires a court 40 ft. x 12 ft. and shuffle board is fun. It also can be played on a concrete platform at home.
