Fr. Eugene B. Hudson Eulogy

Delivered by the Rev. Walter A. Foery, S. T. L., Ph. D., pastor of Holy Rosary Church at the Pontifical Funeral Mass celebrated by Archbishop Mooney for Father Hudson in Holy Rosary Church, Saturday, May 25. Father Hudson who died May 21, was a former editor of the CATHOLIC COURIER.

"No man, no matter how great a power he wields, no matter how world-wide his influence, no matter how great the glory of his achievements, possesses a greater dignity than a priest. On the day of his ordination when his soul is marked with the sacred character of Holy Orders, he carries away with him a dignity which is not human, but divine—not temporal, but eternal. If it is of great importance that God should be honored, if it is of great matter that man should know the way to eternal life, and should have the means to follow that way then submit in the dignity of him who is the instrument, through which this is accomplished.

"If it is of great consequence that each generation of the Church should bear the voice of Christ teaching the way, the truth, and the life, and that men whose souls have been touched by sin need the healing touch of the hand of Christ, and if it is of great matter that the sacrifice of Calvary should be offered from the rising to the setting of the sun, we cannot escape the conclusion that the excellence of the priest's office surpasses all human dignity.

Carries On

"The Priesthood is not of today nor yesterday, but it stretches back through the centuries to that memorable night when Christ on

the eve of his passion and death ordained his Apostles—HIS FIRST PRIESTS. He had given them wondrous powers, powers that would change the face of the earth. He had made them as it were an extension of Himself. He was to leave the world, but they were to continue Him in it. He had redeemed man, but the Apostles were to apply the means of redemption to the soul of men. This was Our Lord's plan. With the coming of the Holy Ghost on Pentecost Sunday they began their sacred mission—a mission that was to last until the end of time, with the passage of the years the Apostles died, but their priesthood did not perish from the earth. The priest lies, but the priesthood never ceases. The powers which Our Blessed Lord gave to the first priests have been handed down and transmitted to other priests. Back through the centuries we can go and follow priests succeeding priests in constant order, and according to the design of the Divine Redeemer perpetuating his work and carrying salvation to all who would accept the Divine message. Hence, it is that each year new recruits are added to the priesthood to take the place of those who have finished their work.

Gladius Struggle

"Four years ago Eugene Hudson was making his immediate preparations for his ordination to the priesthood. His was coming to the end of a victorious struggle that he had gallantly made to attain the objective of his life. With a body that was never robust, with health that continually threatened his very life, but with a soul that desired with desire to give what he had to the service of the Church, he triumphantly reaches the goal. One ideal pushed him on, a great motivating force sustained him—the strength of an unwavering faith in the Christ of his heart gave power to his body that staggered his physicians, and courage to his soul that sent strong men away wondering about its source. He was ordained a priest. The hands of the Pontifical Bishop, the successor of the Apostle, were laid upon his head the Holy Spirit was breathed into his soul. His hands were anointed with Holy Oil, and he was given power to offer the Holy Sacrifice both for the living and the dead. The commission of Christ, to go forth and teach, was given him, and the power to forgive sin was conferred upon him. In his heart there was a desire to make use of these powers. In his soul there was the desire to so use them that he would achieve things for Christ. He understood that if his years were many at least that his priesthood was the extension of priesthood of His Divine Master, and the success of it must be measured by his standards. What are those standards?

"The priest's life is successful when he tells for the extension of the Kingdom of God among men. When he propagates the faith, when he weaves himself out to bring men to participate in the redemption when in obedience to the command of Our Lord he teaches men to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you. With these standards clear before him, mind Father Hudson set out upon a glorious and fruitful career. To some this might seem to be a misstatement of facts, to some it may appear that by reason of his protracted illness he possessed powers that he could not use within him there burned the desire to do, but that desire was never translated into action that the zeal to accomplish things was thwarted by physical handicap. This is not true.

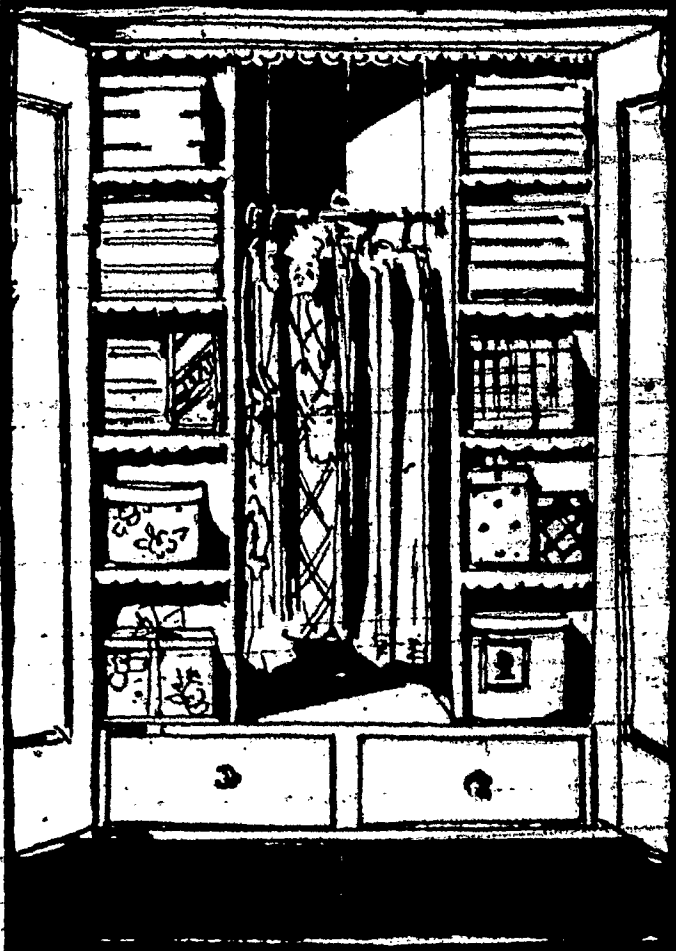
The beginners' class in contract bridge will meet with Mrs. Bradford Noyes on Tuesday evening at 8 o'clock.

Plan Bed Room Corner Closet

EXTRA BEDROOM CLOSET

MANY times, in modernizing an old house, you find limited space for a bedroom closet. I have found it convenient to build the closet in one corner of the room, making it a decorative feature of the room as well as a useful adjunct.

This closet, you will notice, has a pair of long doors which swing over the hanging space and shelves. The interior is divided by two vertical boards, between which a rod is hung and over which the clothes hangers sit.

The space on either side of the vertical board which varies in depth due to the angle of the wall, is used for shelves.

Below are two drawers.

Finish above the doors with wall-board and paper directly over it, matching the room paper.

Carefully consider the storage space you require for your household. Re-analyze your family's needs in terms of closets.

This children's room may be grown-up and require a varying set-up. Think of the storage space for the winter's clothes and the arrangements for cleaning and house-keeping appliances.
