COMMENCEMENT Exercises are just ahead for thousands of pupils completing their courses in Catholic Schools. "What next?" is the big and important question. Who will say where the child is to attend school now? The child, or the parent or both? At least, **prudence** should be exercised in making a choice that will mean so much for the child's entire future.

WHEN it is a question of "buying" a new automobile, everyone in the family is interested — keenly interested. The choice is the subject of discussion for weeks. Every model is tried out by every member of the family. The merits and demerits of the prospective cars are weighed in the balance most carefully. Perhaps the one who must pay the bill says an "Ave" that he will draw a "dund." Now, if all this caution is exercised in the choice of a car that will be laid to rest within a few years in the automobile graveyard, what about the prudence in the choice of the next school for the child who has an immortal soul?

THE modern psychologist speaks of a "dual personality." When religion is divorced from education a dual personality is apt to result, that is, religious life and daily, secular life seldom meet. After all, why speak about religion and education? For religion is education. Without religion there is no genuine education. Most Catholics believe that the parish school is the only school for the Catholic child. By the same token, the Catholic high school and the Catholic college is the only school for the Catholic youth, unless logic is to be scuttled.
