must not propagate their religious creed or any other, and must hold themselves in the highest degree respectful of an obedient to the laws of the country.

6.—An order emanating from the Ministry of Public Education, in the name of Minister Gargan, states that the "Nationalist Calendar and Popular Encyclopedia" is to be adopted by all educational centers and in a special manner in the rural schools.

The Nationalist Calendar and Popular Encyclopedia has the double aim of uprooting religious traditions and of glorifying the revolutionary regime. It has been highly praised in a letter by President Cardenas which declares that the work of spreading the Nationalist Calendar "leads to the lengthening of the bonds of solidarity" and will help in the memory of coming generations "a new spirit in our social classes."

Purposes of Calendar "By instituting in the Calendar festivals for each profession, union or social sector," the President adds, "by affirming the common interests and aspirations of each group, there will be banished from daily life the celebration of religious myths and a great step will have been taken in the task of elevating the spiritual level of the masses."

The Ministry's plan for primary social education has been published in pamphlet form. In the introduction it is stated that the purpose of the primary school in Mexico has been developed on a parallel with all the "revolutionary movements" of 1934 and that the school "has been transformed radically into the Socialist School with the object of preparing the rising generations for the struggle in the coming days against the 'exploited' social regimen."

The pamphlet sets forth many aims and aspirations of the Socialist School, including the following: "to give a real idea of the Universe; it is dehumanizing since it strives to free the people from the imposition of all sorts of idleness and superstition."

Government Requirements In his press interview, Minister Garcia Tellez stated that the Ministry of Public Education, in accordance with the criterion of President Cardenas and faced with the great educational needs of the country, "not only proposes to give facilities for the multiplication of private schools which, with all the advantages of the Government Administration in its delicate service to national education, but will even support them."

The whole tone of the interview, which stipulates that the Government will support private schools shows an eagerness on the part of the Administration to have private institutions take on part of the governmental burden. The Government has greatly increased by the arbitrary closing of all schools, free or otherwise, conducted by Religious Orders and Congregations.

Minister Garcia Tellez also stated that the Government's intervention in "foreign private establishments" is essential. The excuse offered is that foreigners living in Mexico should be educated in their own countries. The Government's selfish formula so that they will not contribute "ethical, economic and spiritual nuclei" dissociated from the purpose which educational reform pursues.

prompted by the growing propaganda of the neo-paganist ideology of the present trend of things in Germany as published by the "Bavarian" political police about "warding off the Jesuits and watching Catholic publications." It is stated April 20, 1935, and says that the Jesuit Order is trying to determine the Third Reich and to make its leaders appear as "despicable." All public lectures by Jesuits are to be suppressed, the circular says, and private lectures by them are to be closely watched. Wherever Jesuits express criticism of the Nazi regime, they must immediately be arrested. Bookstands in Catholic churches, Catholic bookstores, etc., are to be kept under close scrutiny, and publications hostile to the regime are to be confiscated at once.
