## Mrs. W. F. McNamara, Sister of Prelate, Buried in Corning

Funeral services for Mrs. William F. McNamara of this city, formerly of Corning, only surviving sister of the Rt. Rev. Msgr. James Griffin, V. C., pastor of St. Mary's Church, Corning, who died June 17, were held in that city June 14. Solemn High Mass of Requiem was celebrated in St. Mary's Church by Monsignor Griffin, assisted by Deacon, the Rev. John Smith, Livonia; sub-deacon, the Rev. Thomas Fernan, Friendship. In the sanctuary were the Rt. Rev. Msgr. John Lee, Elmira, the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Walter Lee, Geneva, the Rev. Jeremiah Maloy, Hornell, the Rev. William Brien, Elmira, the Rev. Patrick Kelly, Hammondsport, the Rev. Francis Moffet, Addison, the Rev. Edward Lyons, Bath; and the following Cornings: the Rev. Lawrence W. Gannon, the Rev. E. A. Rawlinson and the Rev. Bernard Newcomb.

Bearers were Thomas Healy, Peter Griffin, Henry C. Hubbard, Frank H. Suits, Thomas Burns, and James P. Hallahan. Burial was in St. Mary's Cemetery Corning. Mrs. McNamara, who before her death had made her home with her son, Dr. Joseph J. McNamara of South Franklin Street, was the widow of City attorney William F. McNamara of Corning. She was born in Angella, the daughter of the late Patrick and Jane Holleran Griffin. Her education was obtained in several schools including St. Elizabeth's, Lawrenceville, Albany, Fredonia State Normal and Sacred Heart Academy, Elmira. Mrs. McNamara taught for several years in Hornell High School. Mrs. McNamara was a Catholic laywoman of outstanding character, remarkable ability and growing love. She was a devoted wife and mother and her pleasing personality and generosity won the admiration of all with whom she came in contact.

Survivors are her son, Dr. Joseph J. McNamara of Rochester, two brothers, Monsignor Griffin and Thomas Griffin of Angella; a sister-in-law, Mrs. Elizabeth McNamara of Corning, and a niece, Genevieve L. Griffin of Toledo. Mrs. McNamara was also a sister of the late Attorney John Griffin of Hornell.

## TOTAL OF \$1,500 SENT MISSIONS By AQUINAS UNIT, REPORT SHOWS

The financial report of the Aquinas Institute Mission Unit for the year 1934-1935, just made to the Rev. Leo C. Mooney, Diocesan Director, Society for the Propagation of the Faith, shows a total sum of \$1,500 raised during the year and a sum of \$1,500 sent for Catholic missionary enterprises in foreign lands, after necessary expenses were deducted. A total sum of nearly \$8,000 has been raised and sent to aid in the Propagation of the Faith since 1920 by the Aquinas Mission Unit which is under the direction of the Rev. John O'Donnell. To assist in the money collected, a considerable quantity of medicine and stamps has been sent by the Aquinas Unit to various mission houses.

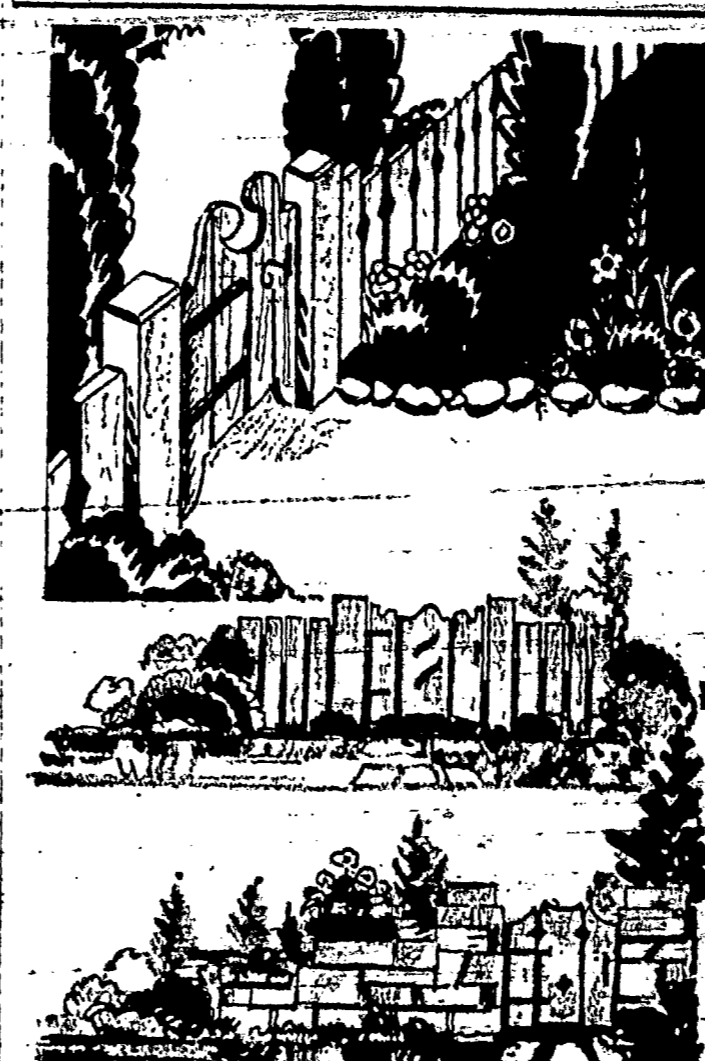

White picket fences and picket  
gates always go well with the Col-  
onial or frame styles, while in a  
brick or English style house a fence  
of wide stained boards with an in-  
teresting designed gate lends much  
attraction to the property. The  
boards may be of varying widths  
set tight together with a narrow  
space between, say from 1/2 inch to  
1/4 inch apart. Or they may be all  
the same width. Possibly the tops  
may be shaped or cutouts between  
the boards resorted to for variety.  
The gates illustrated above are  
well adapted to the latter sort of  
fences. They are easily made of  
wide planks and should be stained  
or gaily painted.
