(Continued from Page One) ing to hitch-hike on the giant plane of Father Coughlin's popularity. A subtle, unknown cleric from Croton Falls, N. Y., presumes to take up the cudgels in behalf of the sanctity of Canon Law, although there are in this country more than 100 Bishops perfectly capable of doing this if they thought for a moment that the teachings of Pope Leo XIII and Pius XI were being distorted in a way to injure the Faith.

Defining Political Activity "This anti-Coughlinite," the editorial says, "claims the right to define political activity. Yet the action of federal courts shows that non-partisan activity is not confined to a political movement in the United States. The Anti-Saloon League exercised a greater influence on legislation than Father Coughlin has attempted to do. The Rev. Michael C. Wall, rector, presented the diploma, and congratulated the graduates on having accomplished their work.

2 African Princesses Invested as Scouts in Nun's Troop in Uganda

New York.—(NCWC)—Two African princesses, daughters of Dowry Chwa, King of Uganda, have been invested as Girl Scouts, or Girl Guides, as the organization is known in British Africa, according to a report which has come from national Girl Scout headquarters here, from Sister M. Anna, a Franciscan nun, who was formerly a Baltimore Girl Scout leader. The princesses are members of Sister Anna's troop of 12 African girls, nearly all betrothed to native who want their wives to be up to the task of conducting a household in the native or European style, she writes. Sister Anna, formerly of the convent of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart in Baltimore, introduced the program on her arrival at the convent of Our Lady of Peace at Nkokonko, Lugazi, Uganda. She had always been an enthusiast in the matter of Girl Scouting, and found that the British encouraged the program in the various schools. Four of Sister Anna's girls are studying in the Normal School, and four in the Hospital Training School for Nurses, which co-operates with her teaching. She also hopes to help train the local school for wives in teaching the art of cooking.
