President's Youth Aid Move of Deep Catholic Interest

Washington (NCWC) By setting up the National Youth Administration President Roosevelt has given more tangible form to a movement which in recent years, especially in the Catholic Church, has rapidly gained momentum.

As chairman of the Executive Committee of the Administration the President has named Miss Josephine Roche, of Colorado, Assistant Secretary of the Treasury in charge of public health, Miss Roche, who has taken an active interest in the development of the youth of the country, has on several occasions appeared before Catholic organizations and conferences on industrial problems.
