WILL WONDERS NEVER CEASE?

Following are excerpts from a letter written May 22nd by John J. Kirkpatrick, Manager of the Municipal Gas and Electric Dept. of the City of Holyoke, Mass.

- (1) "The TVA would probably disagree should I say that the cost of distributing electrical energy, to say nothing about the cost of generation and transmission, is more than the prices the TVA offer to sell electricity for in their published schedule of rates. But it is true, nevertheless. You know it is true, I know it is true, and so does anyone who has sold electricity and studied distribution costs. Everybody knows it but the government. But perhaps the government does not consider costs."
(2) "To be perfectly frank with you, Mr. Cooke, I think that most federal, state and municipal officials have gone 'nutty' on electrical affairs."

The letter from which the above pungent excerpts were taken was written in answer to a letter from Morris L. Cook, Rural Electrification Administrator, in which he asked for suggestions as to how the Rural Electrification Administration can render the greatest Public Service. Again we ask:
