

#### How and What To Serve Hints For the Housewife By MOLLY GAVIN

There are so many ways in which iam can be utilized during the summer months that it seems strange that we ever hesitate before purchasing a whole hams. When a whole ham is cooked it retains its flavor and juices, there-by giving a botter texture to the

Il-the ham is to be served for company dinner, or if your family is large, then the most desirable way of proparing it is to bake it.
Baking a ham is a very simple process if you buy a meed grade sugar cured ham, because it is not necessary to parboll a ham of this

Soak the harn over night and wash it well. Then place it in a covered reasting pan. Four over it sufficient water (about one quart) to cover the bottom of the pan. Cover the rousier and place it in a moderate oven. It requires about 20 minutes to each pound of ham when baking.
