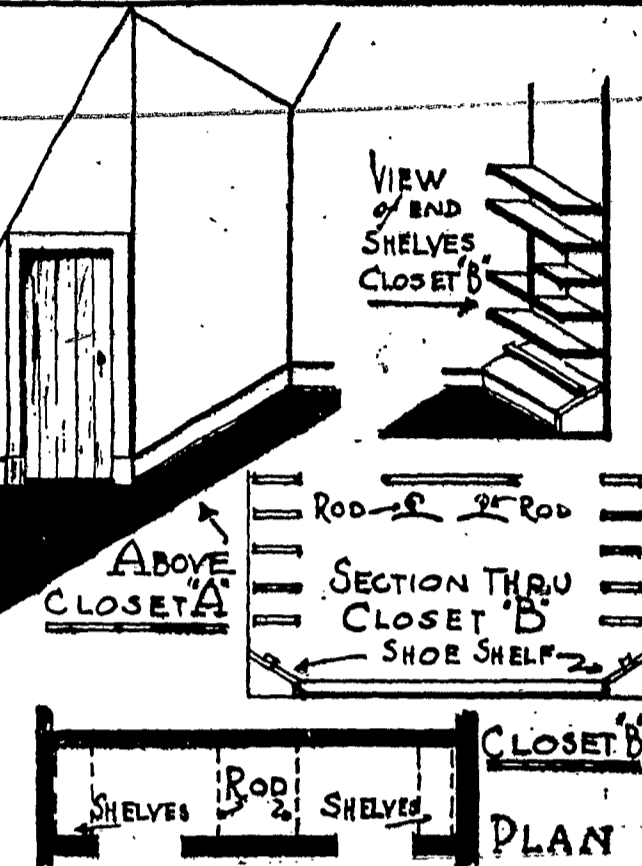
Catholic Missioners Educated Ethiopia Ruler, Article Says

Manila—(NCWC)—The Rev. John M. Lenhart, O. M. Cap., writing in La Defensa here an article on "Abyssinia's Emperor and the Catholic Mission," notes that Ras Tafari, Emperor of Abyssinia (Ethiopia) under the title of Haile-Selassie I, was educated by Catholic missionaries. He also states that the present Emperor's father, Ras Makonnen Tafari personally "was a very religious and an exemplary Christian, although he never joined the Catholic Church."
Father Lenhart quotes Bishop Jarousseau, O. M. Cap., as having written as follows on December 19, 1916, concerning the new regent:
"Ras Tafari Makonnen, the future Emperor of Abyssinia, although he is no Catholic, owes his moral education to the Catholic mission. He likes us very much and trusts us fully. The people call him already the Catholic Emperor and our indignation say: 'We have dethroned a Moslem to make a Catholic our regent.' Yet the Catholics of Abyssinia are entitled to a large share in the victory of Christianity over Islamism. As for their cooperation in Abyssinia, without their cooperation, Ras Tafari would have become Moslem."
"Bishop Jarousseau," Father Lenhart continues, "had reason to call Ras Tafari the leader of the Catholics. On his deathbed the father, Ras Makonnen Tafari, had entrusted his son to the paternal care of Bishop Jarousseau, and the Bishop had reasons to be proud of his pupil."
"A native priest, Abba Samuel, whom Bishop Jarousseau ordained on December 17, 1810, acted as tutor to the young Ras and saved his life in June, 1915, when Ras Tafari suffered shipwreck on one of the lakes, losing his own life in doing so."
"Ras Tafari has shown his gratitude to the Catholic missionaries these many years in spite of great opposition. He braved the excommunication of the Abyssinian Abba, created the Catholic mission posts into private fiefs to protect them against the vexations of hostile neighbors, donated large tracts of land to the Catholic mission, contributed large sums to the erection of buildings and promoted the interests of the mission in every other way. He presented a precious cross to the poor Capuchin Bishop Jarousseau, and entrusted one of the Capuchin missionaries with the compilation of the annals of Abyssinia. An admirable, the vanguard of the country."
In 1924, Ras Tafari visited Europe with a large number of the influential men of the empire. On June 21, he paid his respects to Pope Pius XI, and paid a visit to the Ethiopian legation which is in charge of the Capuchin Fathers. The following day he went up to Frascati to do homage to the memory of Cardinal Massimo, the Apostle of Abyssinia and friend of his father, who passed there the declining years of his life and found there his grave.

DO YOU NEED CLOSETS?
What household ever has enough closets? Here are two ideas for providing closet space.
Closet A is built into one corner of a story and a half home where the roof comes slanting down and forms a bedroom ceiling. You can readily build in this type of a closet, and I think no explanation is necessary. Just a few 2 by 4s and wallboard, a batten door and trim. Then cover with wall paper, and build in the necessary hook strips and shelves.
Closet B is more complicated. To begin with you should have a room from which you may take enough space to amount to 30 inches or 36 inches along one whole side across this end.
Erect a partition and build in two doors. That's simple.
The shelf arrangement, however, is ingenious. To begin with, there are two rods in the central space between the doors over which clothes hangers may be hooked. Above the rods is one wide shelf for storage purposes. At each end of the closet and extending from wall to wall build in first a shoe board. This is nothing more than a 12 inch board set at an incline with a 1/2 inch by 1 inch strip nailed to it over which you place the heels of the shoes.
The shelves are arranged above the shoe shelf, as many as you can get in. Vary the distance between shelves for hat boxes etc.
In the view of end shelves shown above, I have cut the length of one shelf in half and built in a vertical board between two shelves. This will give you a large space for hat boxes.
This pair of closets, although really one closet, will provide a great deal of storage space. To make the closet handler, install an electric light and a small window built in if one side of the closet is on an outside wall.

'At War' Declares Berlin Diocesan Catholic Newspaper

opponent and that the Catholic Church has picked it up.
The Nationalist proclamation appeared in the form of huge purple posters which, plastered on all Berlin billboards and reproduced in other parts of the country, starting the German population returning to work Monday morning. It is signed by the National Socialist party of the Greater Berlin district of which Dr. Goebbels is the head, and uses as its central argument charges made by National Socialist police of three smaller towns that members of Catholic organizations in union with communists had desecrated Catholic churches, damaged Catholic symbols and revived a Catholic Bishop, solely for the purpose of discrediting the National Socialist movement. On the basis of these charges, which paralleled the Nazi contention that Jews and "Marxists" were responsible for the anti-Jewish excesses in Germany, the proclamation says:
"Germans, hark! Conscienceless agitators are at work to drive you into a Kulturkampf. They misuse religion for a base political purpose. That is sabotage of the nation's domestic peace. Lies and the like are being used because other means fail."
While the Fuehrer is victorious in completing the greatest political battle in history to win work and freedom for the German people, Catholic "enter forces are working arm in arm with Bolshevism and employ its methods against the National Socialist State which has saved Europe and its culture from Bolshevist annihilation."
"Devises to generate contempt for these traitors to the people who would conduct their dirty business under the mask of religion. Eternal enemies of the Reich want to destroy German unity. The government and the party will soon end their shameless activity. You, German people take care and beware of obscurantists who come in sheep's clothing but are clawing wolves inside!"

HOLY FATHER EXPRESSES FEAR OVER OUTCOME

Vatican City An indication of how strained relations between the Holy See and Germany have become was given Monday by the Pope who expressed the opinion that difficult times were ahead in an address delivered to fifty German boys belonging to the Catholic Action movement of Trier archdiocese whom he received in his Summer residence at Castel Gandolfo.
The Pope said the presence of the German boys reminded him of many happy and many sorrowful things. It was a reason for sorrow to think that some abandoned persons had undertaken a battle against God and against Christ in favor of modern paganism, but it was a cause of happiness to think that there were in Germany so many pious strong young men conquerable in their faith.
"It is necessary," he added, "never to lose courage but to stand always ready to defend one's religion, trusting in God, because the present moment is difficult, but even more difficult times are impending."
The Pope ended by blessing his visitors and their families and the whole Catholic German family. Particularly he blessed "the bishops and the clergy who are in great tribulation and the young people of Germany who are fighting a great battle in defense of their faith."
