ANNUAL AURIESVILLE PILGRIMAGE—August 25
Our annual pilgrimage to the Shrine of the North American Martyrs at Auriesville will be on Sunday, August 25, via the New York Central Railroad. The pilgrimage train will leave the Central Avenue Station at 8 A. M., arriving at Auriesville in time for Mass at the Coliseum. The return train will leave the Shrine at 9:00, arriving in Rochester at 9:40 P. M.

Nestling amid the rugged beauty of the Adirondack foothills is the newly created Shrine of North America's Martyr Saints at Auriesville, N. Y., and one which is rapidly becoming endeared to the hearts of American Catholics. The village of Auriesville is situated on the Mohawk River, about forty miles west of Albany, and in this hallowed spot has been dedicated the Shrine of Our Lady of Martyrs in memory of the eight of the North American Martyrs.

It marks the site of the cruel death of the great American missionary, Saint Isaac Jogues, S. J., at the hands of the ferocious Indians, to whose salvation he had devoted his priestly life. The other martyr suffering a similar fate, whose memory the shrine perpetuates, are Fathers Jean de Brebeuf, S. J., Gabriel Lalumet, S. J., Antoine Daniel S. J., Charles Garnier, S. J., Noel

Chabanel, and two lay brothers of the Jesuit Order, Rene Goupil and John de la Lande. Another honored at Auriesville is Catherine Tegakwitha, an Indian maiden, who, through her suffering for the faith, has become known as the "Elly of the Mohawks."

The Shrine at Auriesville is well arranged to care for pilgrims. Ample hotel and dining room facilities are available. The chief buildings are the Coliseum and Chapel of the Martyrs, where Mass is offered up daily and other holy services are held for the benefit of pilgrims. Interesting features of the Shrine are the exhibits as displayed in the Show Room with the altar of the Martyr Saints. One may also inspect in the new museum many Indian relics found on the Shrine grounds as a result of excavations. Articles are also procurable for those who wish to secure pious mementoes of their visit to the Auriesville Shrine.

Round trip fare is \$2.50, children under 12, half fare. It is important that you buy your railroad tickets early in order that accommodations may be provided to insure the utmost comfort of the large number of people who will go on the pilgrimage.

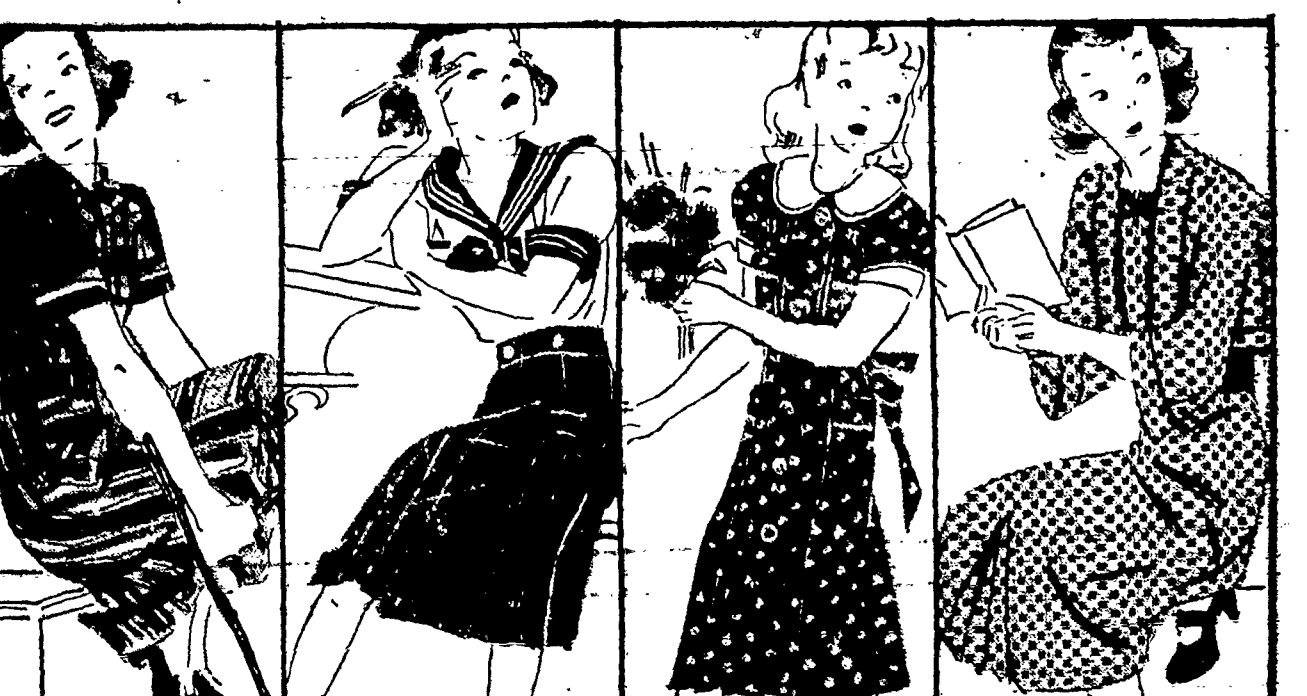
