Rose Show Plans Nearing Completion

Plans of the various committees are rapidly nearing completion for the Fall Rose Show which will be staged in Convention Hall September 9 and 10. Practically all of the 15,000 square feet of floor space at the Hall has already been allotted and entrants are fast filling up the competitive classes.

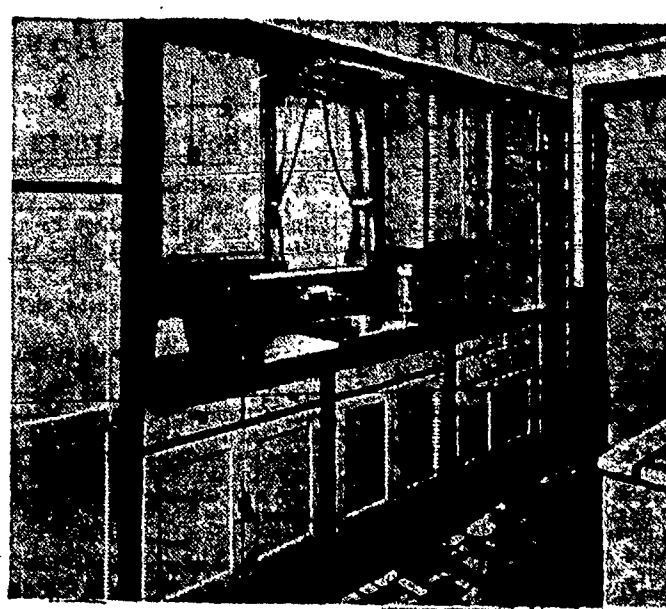
The drab interior of Convention Hall will be changed into a wonderland of beauty. The entire center portion will be occupied by roses of all types. Around the edges of the Hall will be more roses combined with lovely displays of foliage, perennials, annuals, shrubs and trees.

An outstanding feature of the Show will be the numerous exhibits of the newer varieties of roses. Among these will be the Rochester Rose, Eclipse, Gloaming, Alice Harding, White Earl of Carlisle, Polar Bear, Empire State, Fred Walker and William Moore.

In addition to the rose exhibits, other plant materials for use in connection with rose gardens will be shown. Visitors to the Show will be able to get useful ideas for their Fall planting and they will see how to arrange roses to the best advantage, both inside and outside of the home.

Q. What is meant by "acid-resisting" enamel in speaking of kitchen sinks?
A. There are two kinds of enamel used in making plumbing fixtures. One is called "regular" and the other "acid-resisting." The acid-resisting finish is extremely hard and impervious and cannot be harmed by any of the acids ordinarily used in the home. In fact, the only acid which can attack it is hydrofluoric acid, a glass solvent. In installing new plumbing equipment under the Federal Housing Administration you should consider buying fixtures with an acid-resisting finish.

HOME IMPROVEMENT -- The Kitchen



Modernization transformed the unsightly kitchen below into the model of efficiency pictured at the left. Ugly, unsanitary open shelves have been replaced by well-arranged cupboards and cabinets. The trim, modern sink is easy to clean and adds to the efficiency by centering the work of food preparation. Fresh paint, attractive floor covering and up-to-date equipment complete this "studio of culinary art."

New Hospital Plan Of Insurance Meets Favor in Industries

The number of subscribers to the Rochester Hospital Service Corporation Plan (Hospital Insurance) had, increased by one-third last week when tabulation of subscribers came from the Camera Works, the Kodak office, and the Hawk-Eye works were completed. Kodak employees joining the new plan for paying hospital bills number 1,470, plus 1,300 dependents, or a total of 2,770 persons eligible for hospital coverage.

Subscriptions were taken for the three Kodak establishments named during the first half of August, and the three groups of employees were covered for hospital bills that might occur after August 15. The Kodak Park subscription list, because of the large number of employees involved, did not close until September 1.

Nearly 6 per cent of the employees in the three plants subscribed. Mr. Meach, Managing Director, said this was a fine percentage and the large membership was due to two months of thorough planning on the part of the Kodak Company, so that all employees were well informed of the Hospital Plan and its benefits.
