### Nazareth Society Sends Special Pamphlet Out On Eucharistic Congress

At the special request of the Most Reverend Joseph Schrembs, D. D., Bishop of Cleveland and President of the Seventh National Eucharistic Congress to be held in Cleveland, Ohio, September 23 to 26, the Catholic Information Society of Nazareth, Pa., has prepared a pamphlet entitled "Trump! Trump! the Catholics are marching on Cleveland!"

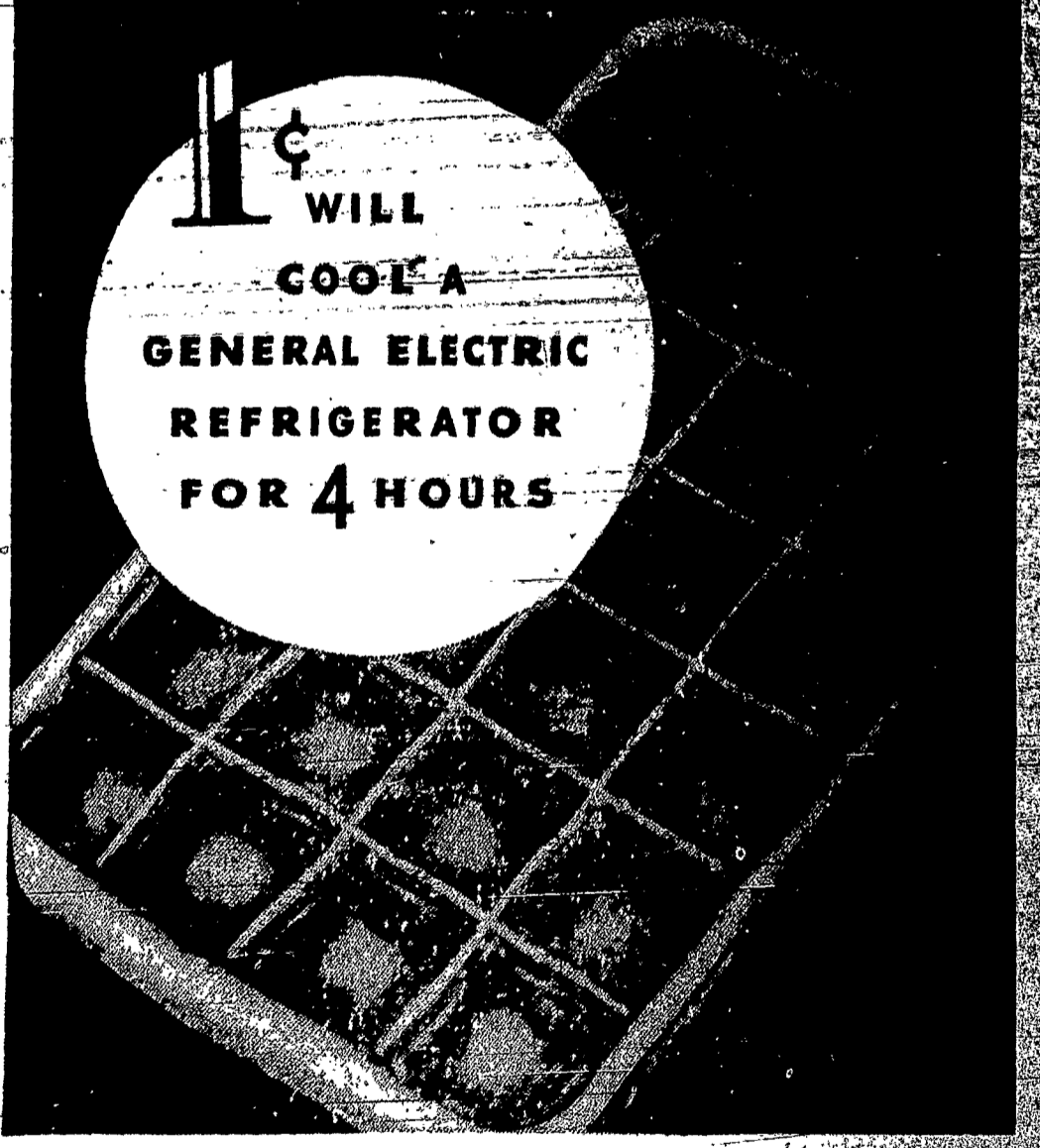
