Diocesan Teachers' Institute Scheduled Oct. 31 At Aquinas

The Thirty-first Annual Conference of the teachers of the diocese of Rochester will be held in Aquinas Institute, Thursday, October 31, according to an announcement by the Rev. John M. Duffy, Superintendent of Schools.

All teachers of the elementary and high school departments will be in attendance. A program carrying the names of many leaders in the educational field of the State promises to be worthwhile.

Rev. Charles P. Hilbert, M. M. will give the opening address, "Missions as an Aid to Teaching." The elementary department will hear Dr. Benedict J. Duffy discuss Health Habits, and Dr. Wm. Paul Brown, Supervisor of the School Medical Service of the State Department, "The Healthy Child Steps Ahead in Learning."

Rev. John M. Duffy will talk to the teachers of the lower grades on "Learning to Spell." Sr. Frances Teresa of Nazareth Academy will meet with the same group as she discusses "The Teaching of Poetry in Grades 1-3." The program for this section will be complete with a talk on "Book Collections or Libraries" by Mrs. Damon Rider, of the Library Department of Genesee Normal School.

Teachers of the upper grades will have a talk on General Science by Mr. Harry A. Carpenter, Specialist in Science in the Rochester Schools. Mr. F. Eugene Seymour, Supervisor of Mathematics of the State Department of Education has chosen as the topic for this same group, "Fitness of Inculcative Geometry and Algebra as Part of the Syllabus for Grades 7 and 8."

The High School Group will meet with Mr. Norvell who will talk on present trends in English under the title "Using the New Syllabus in English." Mrs. Rider will treat high school phases of library work, and Mr. Seymour will take up the question, "What is the Immediate Future of High School."
