Church, Groton, was received in audience by the Holy Father, Pope Pius XI, and presented a portable typewriter to His Holiness.

May, 1935—The Rev. Thomas Gilhooly, C.S.S.R., of St. Mary's Redemptorist Mission Band, Buffalo, opened the annual novena to Our Lady at St. Alphonsus Church, Auburn.

May, 1935—The Rev. Eugene A. Giel, S.J., native of Rochester, was assigned to leave Buffalo with six other Jesuits, for the Philippines.

May, 1935—The name of St. John Fisher, illustrious English martyr just canonized, was given to a new chapel erected between East Bay and Soda Bay.

May, 1935—Memorial Day services conducted for the first time, were held at St. Mary's Church, South Street, by the Rev. Dr. George F. Kettell.

May, 1935—The Most Rev. Archbishop Edward Hanna celebrated the golden anniversary of his ordination to the Holy Priesthood at Rome, on Ascension Thursday.

May, 1935—Demonstration of the activities carried on by the girls at Holy Angels Home, Winton Road, North, was given at the annual spring convocation, May 27.

May, 1935—James E. O'Call, headmaster and prominent Catholic layman, presented Grand Knight of the Knights of Columbus, Dr. Walter E. O'Call, with three terms as head of Holy Cross.

June, 1935—Thirteen members of the 1935 graduating class of St. Bernard's Seminary were ordained by the Most Rev. Archbishop Edward Mooney, Bishop of Rochester, on June 15.

June, 1935—The Rev. William I. Lonergan, S.J., associate editor of America, was retreat master at the annual laymen's retreat at St. Bernard's Seminary.

June, 1935—Sister Ellen Marchner, formerly of Webster, now a member of the Missionary Sisters Servants of the Holy Ghost, before leaving for China, paid a brief visit to Rochester and Webster.

June, 1935—The Rev. Leo William Welch, S.J., son of Mr. and Mrs. Patrick F. Welch of Webster, celebrated his first Solemn Mass in Holy Trinity Church, Webster, Sunday, June 30.

June, 1935—In the first ceremony of its kind, 350 adults, mostly converts, received the Sacrament of Confirmation from the hands of the Most Rev. Archbishop Edward Mooney, Bishop of Rochester, in St. Patrick's Cathedral.

June, 1935—Clifford Bishop, 13-year-old pupil of St. Alphonsus parochial school, won second place in the Cayuga County Spelling Contest, held in Auburn Junior High School.

June, 1935—Over four hundred graduates received diplomas from Rochester's four Catholic high schools: Nazareth Academy, Mercy High, Aquinas Institute and Sacred Heart Academy.

June, 1935—The Rev. Patrick J. Neville, former pastor of St. Rose's Church, Lyons, and of St. Bridget's Church, East Bloomfield, died at the age of 71.
