**July 1935**—The Most Rev. Edward J. Hanna, D.D., retired Archbishop of San Francisco, received on the occasion of his jubilee as a priest, the parchment dedication page of a volume, the gift of the Rt. Rev. McGr. George Lacombe, priest of the Archdiocese of San Francisco and Research-Professor of Medieval History at the Catholic University, who died in Paris before the occasion of the jubilee, which was in May, 1935.

**July 1935**—The Rev. John Lynch, C.S.S.R., of St. Joseph's Church, Franklin Street, celebrated the golden jubilee of his religious profession in the congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer on July 30. Father Lynch was for 21 years a worker in the missionary field of Puerto Rico.

**July 1935**—Dr. George Gregory Carroll, noted doctor and Knight of the Order of Pope St. Sylvester died on July 21 at the age of 61.

**July 1935**—Miss Rosemary Schilf, Betty Frank and Mary Doyle, alumnae of Nazareth College, returned from the Washington Youth Institute conducted by the National Council of Catholic Women.

**July 1935**—John J. Leo of Auburn was elected to head the officers of Central New York Chapter, Knights of Columbus, at the quarterly meeting held in Geneva.

**August, 1935**—Sister M. Tarciana, O.S.F., formerly Miss Agnes Scheid, daughter of Mrs. Mamie J. Scheid, 24 Niagara Avenue, visited briefly in Rochester, before leaving for missionary duties in Jamaica, West Indies.

**August, 1935**—A Solon High Mass ceremony marked the closing of the second summer session of the Pan-Y School of Liturgical Music, conducted by St. Charles of Solon.
