Mexican Government Denies Bishops' Petition for Repeal Of Laws Persecuting Church

Reply Made Through Cardenas Cabinet Officer Evades Charges Made by Prelate; Resorts To Recalling Alleged Inquisition Cruelties

NEWS SERVICE) Mexico City, Nov. 5—The long awaited reply to the Mexican Bishops' appeal to President Lazaro Cardenas for the repeal of the new Law for the Nationalization of Property and the amendment of Articles 3, 24, 27 and 130 of the Federal Constitution, has been made by Minister of Gobernacion Silvano Barba Gonzalez. The reply is regarded here as just as nebulous as the "Historical and Legal Essay" prepared by Emilio Portes Gil, then Attorney General of the Republic. now head of the National Revolutionary Party. The latter document was published in English by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs under the title "The Conflict between the Civil Power and the Clergy.'



Perhaps the saving touch in this moreel of uncertain grammar and shakier logic is the capitalization of "one," in the last sentence. That is emphasis but a single step removed from an adroitly defensive gesture.

AND. SURELY a defensive gesture is a fitting period to so flaccici an array of presumptuous assumptions, and non sequiturs compounded with misnomers. The "warfare . . . to insure better motion pictures" was not a "fight" but an attack! It was not ended in victory" because there may be no erect to the vigitance which alone can insure the establishment and maintenance of decent moral standards in public entertainment. Moreover, to talk of "victory" is to ignore the persistently obvious fact that Class C pictures lindecent and immoral and unfit for public entertainment comprise a sizable proportion of current movie listings.

PERHAPS the whole story is revealingly hidden in the third paragraph. After all, are not "the picture producers" estentiesty noble fellows who, in "responding to the demand for clean and better films," in reality conceded "victory" in a "Fight" which hart their finer sensibilities as much as it did thesis pocketbooks? Should we not weep in sympathy with these Galahads of the Galloping Tintypes because the measure of public support is sometimes less than the results searcant"?

YES. INIDEED! But the movie people, and the writers of editorials for their behalf, should not forget that the producers made the indocent and immoral pictures-not their public. And that the public will not fill their theaters if their pictures are clean-and nothing more. And that one masterpiece does not make a renaissance.-H.W.K.
