a member of the N.C.W.C. Administrative Board since September, 1927. Following his election he was chosen to be Episcopal Chairman of the N.C. Legal Department and, in November, 1929, was also named Treasurer of the Administrative Board. He held these offices on the Committee until his retirement this year.

Bishop Lillis had served continuously on the Administrative Board for more than a decade. He was elected a member of the Committee in 1924. He served as Vice Chairman of the Board for a number of years, in addition to being Episcopal Chairman of the N. C. Department of Social Action.

Upon the resignation of Archbishop Edward J. Hanna as Chairman of the Board last March, Bishop Lillis was named Acting Chairman. While holding this latter office, he also served as Episcopal Chairman of the N.C.W.C. Department of Catholic Action.

The text of the statement on Catholic Action follows:
"The Bishops of the National Catholic Welfare Conference in the General Assembly of Washington, November 14, 1935, all Catholics of all States to the distinction between Catholic activity and Catholic Action."

The Bishops remind all Catholics of the instruction of our Holy Father, Pope Pius XI, that there is to be such thing as Catholic Action until there is an Episcopal commission.

For a discussion of this instruction, see the issue of the Catholic Courier for a discussion of a meeting of the Bishops of the United States, held in Washington, D. C., on October 10, 1935. The Holy Father's instruction is a call to the universal Church to organize Catholic Action. The Bishops of the United States, in their meeting, have taken the first step in this direction.
