Our representatives at the Fifteenth annual convention, N.C.C.W., held in Fort Wayne Nov. 27-28 returned with most enthusiastic reports.

At the Diocesan Presidents pre-convention meeting held on Saturday, one-minute reports were made by each diocesan president.

The Rochester report was as follows: Number of denneries and districts in diocese - 6. Number of active deanery and district councils - 6.

Number of diocesan board meetings held - 3. Number of district meetings held - 3.

Number of churches with resident pastors - 132. Number of affiliations in good standing - 10.

Suggestions for a Rural Diocesan Program was made at length by Miss Julia Connor, of the Fair Credit Administration.

At a supper meeting later an interesting discussion of 4-H Clubs was held Miss Connor presiding.

The evening reception to delegates and visitors was presided by a most interesting concert given by the Slovak Band of Whiting, Indiana. We hope it may be our privilege to hear them in Rochester at some future time.

It would be impossible to describe adequately the beauty of a Pontifical High Mass at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception on Sunday morning.

Most Rev. Urban Veh, Bishop of Denver, was the celebrant. The sermon by Most Rev. John J. McNichols, O.P., S.S.D., Archbishop of Cincinnati, on "Youth and Parenthood" was broadcast over a nationwide hook-up.

In the afternoon, a drive to our St. Victor Plant at Huntington, Ind. with tea at Victory. Not the home of the Missionary Oblates, was followed by benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament in the beautiful chapel, and a luncheon in honor of the visitors.

At the mass meeting in the evening at the Shrine Auditorium only 250 filled the hall.
