## Parliament Members Pledges To Inquire Into Belfast Riots

London (NCI)—Forty parliamentary candidates in the Glasgow constituency pledged themselves, if elected, to demand from the government the appointment of a court of inquiry in Belfast, to determine the origin and circumstances of the recent riots. About half of them were elected affirmatively to a questionnaire submitted by the Catholic Union of Glasgow with the approval of the Archbishop.

## Questionnaire Seeks Views and Reactions Of Catholic Students

Milwaukee, Wis. (NCI)—The views and reactions of thousands of Catholic students in the Catholic high schools of Wisconsin are being sought in a questionnaire survey being made by the Catholic Herald-Citizen, Catholic paper here. Replies were received from 3578 students.

Tabulation of the 502,020 answer is to the 90 pertinent questions asked has begun. The questions sought to gather the students' opinions on a variety of topics dealing with their life in which they live, such as companions, dates, homes, parents, discipline, recreation and hobbies, comic strips, radio programs, sermons, and family prayers.

The blanks were assigned and the students supervised in answering them. They were deposited in sealed boxes in the various schools.
