...of their children, they are within their rights.

"To a Catholic there is no truer religion other than the Catholic religion, and for this reason, it is not left to accept or to recognize any education that is not Catholic education."

**Encyclical Teachings**

The third, fourth and fifth points stressed are quoted from Pope Pius XI's Encyclical of Christian Education of Youth:

"Every form of pedagogic naturalism which in any way excludes or weakens super-natural Christian formation in the teaching of youth, is false. Every method of education founded, wholly or in part, on the denial or forgetfulness of original sin and of grace, and relying on the sole powers of human nature, is unsound."

"It is too common the error of those who propagate a so-called sex-education, that from the fact that they can form youth against the dangers of sensuality by means of purely natural, such as a foolishly imitated and precautionary instruction for all indiscriminately, even in public, and worse still, by exposing them at an early age to the ocean, in order to accustom them, so it is argued, and as it were to harden them against such dangers."

"False also and harmful to Christian education is the so-called method of co-education. This too, by many of its supporters, is founded upon naturalism and the denial of original sin. There is not in nature itself, which fashions the two quite different in organism, temperament, in abilities, anything to suggest that there can be or ought to be promiscuity, and much less equality, in the training of the two sexes."

Sixth, the Pastoral instruction to the Apostolic Delegate's instruction to Mexican Catholics of last January, and from various pronouncements of the Mexican hierarchy to show that Catholics cannot rightfully attend or send their children to either public or private schools so long as the requirements of Article 3 of the Mexican Constitution are in force, and that parents who keep their children in the Socialist schools are "committing a very grave mortal sin which cannot be absolved in Confession until the children are withdrawn from these establishments." It cites further the words of His Holiness Pope Pius XI "Socialism and Catholicism are two contradictory terms, no one can be at the same time a good Catholic and a true Socialist."

The Pastoral ten takes up the matter of excommunication.

Question of E-communication.

"On the other hand" it reads "it fitting that we inform everyone that parents who send their children to schools which are or ought to be officially subject to Article 3 as amended for the present are not subject to excommunication, nor are the pupils themselves who frequent them because under existing circumstances the prelates have not published the warning required by Canon Law in such matters, if such warning should be given, then six months after the date of warning these parents and pupils would incur excommunication if there had not been sufficient amendment to remove grounds for suspecting that aid was being given to the diffusion of an error such as Socialism."

A mother who has been unable to secure her husband's consent in keeping the children away from Socialist schools, can receive the Sacraments, the Pastoral states, providing she does everything possible to give her children religious instruction to offset the evil effects of anti-religious education. Although there is no excommunication, it adds parents who do not comply with the Church's admonition in this matter "an grievously and their Confessions are void if they do not confer this sin, nor promising sincere amendment. This also applies to children who have reached the age of reason and are able to withdraw from such schools. Confessors are instructed to question both parents and children on this subject before granting absolution.

These regulations, the Pastoral clearly states, are for all the dioceses in Mexico.

**Joseph Scott Gets Catholic Action Award at St. Bona's**

St. Bonaventure, N. Y. (NC) — In previous years St. Bonaventure College has honored on Sunday its choice for the Catholic Action Medal for 1935. The medal was awarded to Joseph Scott, lawyer and orator of Los Angeles.

Mr. Scott was chosen, it was announced, because of his devoted, consistent and outstanding services in the field of Catholic Action under the leadership of his ecclesiastical superiors. He is an alumnus of St. Bonaventure College and served as professor at this institution from 1929 to 1935.

The Catholic Action Medal has been approved of the Holy Father and is conferred with episcopal sanction. In 1933 the recipient was former governor Alfred E. Smith. In 1934, it was awarded to Michael Williams, Editor of The Commonwealth.

Washington (NC) — An improvement in the motion picture productions from the United States is noted in Spain since the campaign of the Legion of Decency began, according to a letter received by William P. Morrison, Director of the Legal Department of the National Catholic Welfare Conference.

The letter is from Jose Torre de Rodas, editor of *El Financiero*, official motion picture organ of the Catholic Parents Association in Spain.

Requesting information on the work of the Legion of Decency in the United States, Sr. Torre writes: "We congratulate you most heartily on the news reports that you have sent us which are evidence that there has been noticeable improvement in the morality of pictures that are being publicly exhibited in your country. We are happy also to report that here in Spain we, too, have noticed that in all motion picture productions coming from the United States there is a marked improvement."
