Refusal of Catholics To Teach Prevention of Birth Is Upheld

London (AP)—Catholic officials who decline to support the teaching of birth prevention in clinics to which they are already attached are protected by the Ministry of Health, it was stated by Dr. Leath Fairfield in a speech to members of the Southwark Catholic Nurses' Guild.

But though existing Catholic officers are not placed in jeopardy, Dr. Fairfield explained that the Ministry of Health cannot compel health authorities to engage people who do not believe in birth prevention. It would appear, therefore that while Catholic nurses who already have jobs will not lose them on account of the increasing acceptance of birth prevention principles by local authorities, the field of employment for them is limited and it is possible that promotion may in some cases be impeded.
