"NOT WITHOUT SURPRISE DID I LEARN THAT THIS HAS BEEN ACCOMPLISHED WITHOUT ANY SIGNAL DISPLAY OF INDIVIDUAL GENEROSITY IN ITS FAVOR, THIS MUCH IS CERTAIN, HOWEVER, THAT THE HOPES AND PLANS OF MY BELOVED PREDECESSOR IN ITS REGARD, HOPES AND PLANS WHICH I HEARTILY MAKE MY OWN, CANNOT BE REALIZED UNLESS ITS CIRCULATION IS STILL FURTHER INCREASED.

"THIS IS NECESSARY EVEN IN A MATERIAL WAY TO ENHANCE ITS VALUE AS A MEDIUM OF PUBLICITY AND THUS INSURE THE PATRONAGE WHICH, AS A MATTER OF BUSINESS IS REQUIRED FOR ITS DEVELOPMENT. THIS IS NECESSARY IN A WIDER AND DEEPER SENSE TO MAKE IT MORE ADEQUATELY REPRESENTATIVE OF THE DIOCESE WHICH IT SERVES. I TRUST, THEREFORE, THAT THOSE INTO WHOM HOME THE COURIER DOES NOT NOW COME WILL... GIVE ASSURANCE OF THEIR SUPPORT OF THIS IMPORTANT DIOCESAN ENTERPRISE.

"IN CONCLUSION, THEN, I EARNESTLY BESPEAK FOR THE CATHOLIC COURIER, THE UNITED AND GENEROUS SUPPORT OF OUR PRIESTS AND PEOPLE AND I FERVENTLY HOPE THAT IT MAY CARRY INTO EVERY HOME IN THE DIOCESE THE SALUTARY INFLUENCE OF THE CATHOLIC PRESS."

Cardinal, Announcing New Youth Group, Cites Failure Of Penology as Crime Curb

Card. Hayes, In Statement, Deplores Low Ages of Criminals—Points to Increased Leisure As Factor—Sets Forth Church's Role in Meeting Problem

New York—(C.N.C.)—Revelation of an important part of the recreational work for youth in the Archdiocese of New York was announced yesterday by Patrick Cardinal Hayes, Archbishop of New York.

The Cardinal, in a statement, announced the formation of a new youth organization, the Catholic Youth Association, which will have a membership of more than 1,000 boys and girls and will include a wide range of leisure and recreational facilities. The Cardinal stated that the new organization will be under the auspices of the Division of Social Action, Catholic Charities of New York.

In a statement directing attention to the decrease in the age level among criminals, and declaring that penology has not thus far appreciably reduced crime, Cardinal Hayes declares that all that can be done cannot combat the subversive influences attacking youth under social and economic conditions which have greatly increased leisure while decreasing the proportionate number of active parents.
