Jesuit Will Conduct Alumnae Retreat at Mercy High School

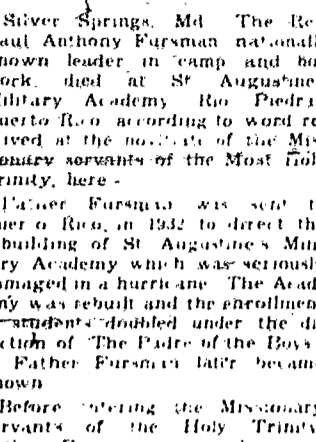
The second annual Day of Retreat for the alumnae of Our Lady of Mercy High School will be held Sunday, March 13.
