

# PRIESTS OF QUEBEC PROVINCE GIVEN REMINDER OF ELECTIONS

Quebec—(NC)—His Eminence Rodrigue Cardinal Villeneuve, Archbishop of Quebec, has had inserted in L'Action Catholique a brief letter clarifying certain reports that have recently been widely published concerning elections in Canada.

The Cardinal's message is clear that what has been done in this matter in recent days is that the Bishops of the Province of Quebec have again called to the attention of priests the provisions in a pastoral document issued two months ago, and dealing with the duties of priests in relation to political questions. This was done in a private letter which somehow found its way into the press.

Last summer, both federal and provincial elections and an election for the Provincial Legislature were held. Before leaving on his annual mission voyage to the Vatican, the Cardinal Archbishop thought it pertinent to remind his people of their duties as citizens to vote and not to succumb to the wiles of unscrupulous politicians. He recalled all the principles enunciated by his predecessors in the See of Quebec.

The federal elections passed off satisfactorily, but in the months during the provincial elections, politicians resorted to money, drinks and promises of jobs in their efforts to bribe voters. The clergy intervened to the extent of reminding Catholics of the Cardinal's warning. This led certain politicians to accuse the clergy of meddling in politics. Upon his return from the Vatican, His Eminence found it necessary to issue another Pastoral, which was read in all the churches and chapels of the Archdiocese on January 28. In this Pastoral the Cardinal pointed out that politicians against priests should be brought before the people and ecclesiastical courts and that any charges against them, with proper evidence, should be brought to the archdiocesan tribunal.

Later His Eminence addressed the private letter to the clergy, which was signed jointly by the Bishops of the Archdiocese of Quebec, Montreal and Ottawa, in which extracts from the Pastoral of Quebec and from Canon Law, dealing with the conduct of priests with respect to political matters, were recalled. This document fell into the hands of a Protestant journalist who published extracts from it which were used in the provincial and federal press.

## Christian Doctrine Course By Mail Is Initiated By Pupils

Oakland, Calif. (NC)—With no less an exemplar than St. Paul himself, the St. Vincent de Paul Society of St. Mary's College, Moraga, has inaugurated a correspondence course in Christian Doctrine. Spurred on by the accomplished efforts of St. Paul in teaching Corinthians and Galatians and the rest of his letters, the students of the Society have undertaken to send by mail complete lessons in Christian Doctrine to farm children of Contra Costa County.

The mail method of providing these children with an opportunity of knowing their religion is proving most effective.

## Sacred Congregation's Special Instruction on Mission Welfare Work

Rome (NC)—The Sacred Congregation of Propaganda Fide regarding missions in the various parts of the world, has issued a special instruction on all religious orders of women.

This document is published in agreement with the Sacred Congregation for Religious, and is described as an indication of the constant efforts made by the Holy See to have Catholic missionary work conform to the varying needs of times and places.

The instruction expresses the wish that new religious institutes of women be founded whose special purpose will be to conduct health work in the missions. It also urges the formation within existing sisterhoods of special branches for this particular work.

Rules are given for the guidance of religious in the exercise of missionary assistance, and special instructions for their scientific and technical training.

"Soviet agricultural collectivization was brought into existence at the price of the starvation of 500,000 small farm holders, forcibly deported to the Arctic on open freight trucks, with no adequate clothing and no provision for housing."

"This deportation, one of the most cruel crimes in history with its dreadful toll of death, from cold, hunger and disease, was accomplished by the shooting of thousands of innocent men, women and children, and the seizure of their homes."

"Communist in the United States are openly working for the overthrow of government by force and violence, and the establishment of the reign of terror and religious freedom of speech and of the Press. No sane Christian can be a Communist."

"Lack of any people not be let alone by Communist propaganda. Being an integral part of the World Communist Party, the Communist Youth International has the same objectives and seeks to carry on the same methods as the international itself."
