SURVEY SHOWS SHARP DROP IN DONATIONS TO 25 PROTESTANT SECTS

New York (NC) A survey of the Research Department of the Federal Council of Churches of Christ in America reveals that annual gifts of 25 Protestant sects have dropped 43 per cent in the seven-year period—from 1928 to 1935.

While there was a slight increase in 1935 over 1934, total gifts declined from \$532,308,714 in 1928 to \$304,002,400 in 1935. The report states that virtually all the sects maintained their per capita contributions for congregational expenses better than those for benevolence.

Vicious Magazines Attack Launched By Women's Group

A very necessary piece of work has been undertaken by the Jefferson City, Mo. Council of Catholic Women, in an attempt to clean the newsstands of the community of objectionable magazines.

The list of periodicals of this nature, submitted to the Prosecuting Attorney, contains not less than 34 titles, and at least two thirds of the magazines are said to be on display in the stores of that city.

The Women's Council has been assured of the support of the Prosecuting Attorney and of the local press. The undertaking is called laudable by the Jefferson City "Post-Tribune," whose editorial on the subject points to the fact that objectionable magazines and books are available at the same time to high school boys and girls.

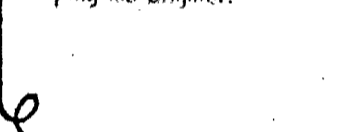
